

32nd ANNUAL FORT LAUDERDALE TO KEY WEST RACE

JANUARY 10th – 12th, 2007

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Ocean sailing boats from 25' LOA and larger are invited to the 21st Annual Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race, starting on January 10th, 2007
- The Skipper's Meeting shall be held at the Lauderdale Yacht Club, 1725 SE 12th Street, Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33316 at 1830 on Tuesday, January 9th, 2007. LYC Phone: 954-524-5500
- Participants are advised that special care of the living coral reefs, sea turtles and manatees along the Florida coast is the responsibility of the Skipper and Crew.

OFFICIAL NOTICE & CONDITIONS OF RACE

1.0 TITLE / DATES / CLASSES / VENUE

- 1.1 The 2007 Fort Lauderdale to Key West Race will be held January 10th –12th, 2007.
- 1.2 The Fort Lauderdale to Key West race is a 160-mile coastal race for ocean racing / cruising monohull and multihull boats. Classes expected to compete include PHRF (with handicaps 180 sec/mile or less), IRC, One-Design ocean racing classes with minimum 5 or more entries and ocean racing/cruising Multihull boats with a current valid MASF PHRF Multihull Rating Certificate.
- 1.3 The race will start at 1300, January 10, 2007 off of the Port Everglades (Ft. Lauderdale) inlet and finish in Key West, Florida.

2.0 RULES

- 2.1 The Race will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the current *Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*, the PHRF of Southeast Florida Rules & Regulations as adopted and amended by the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race Committee, the current IRC Rules #1, 2, & 3, the Class Rules for eligible One Design Classes, this Notice and Conditions of Race and the Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2 The Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race shall be classified as a Category C event (RRS Appendix 1).

3.0 SAFETY

- 3.1 All boats shall conform to the current International Sailing Federation Special Regulations Governing Offshore and Oceanic Racing, including the *US Sailing* Prescriptions for Monohulls (or Multihulls), **Category 3 With Life Raft**.
- 3.2 Life rafts are not required to have a canopy or insulated floor.
- 3.3 All competing boats shall carry the following NOAA charts Number(s) 11462, 11452 & 11442.
- 3.4 Each Skipper or Owner shall declare his or her vessel's eligibility and shall affirm that the vessel complies with any and all equipment requirements for this race.

4.0 MANAGEMENT

- 4.1 The races and related activities shall be managed by the Fort Lauderdale to Key West Race Committee, a joint committee of the Lauderdale Yacht Club and the Southern Station of the Storm Trysail Club.
- 4.2 The term "Skipper" as used in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions shall mean the person, whether or not the owner or charterer of the boat, who is designated on the entry form as "Skipper" and who is the person in charge of the boat.

5.0 ELIGIBILITY AND RATINGS

- 5.1 The Fort Lauderdale to Key West Race invites ocean racing/cruising boats whose owner / charterer is a member of their National Authority. (U.S. Sailing Association for USA boats.)

- 5.2 **PHRF** boats with a LOA of 25 feet minimum, and rating 180 sec/mi or less, having submitted a completed entry form and a current valid PHRF Certificate obtained from PHRF of Southeast Florida are invited. To obtain a rating from PHRF of S.E. Florida, contact PHRF of Southeast Florida at www.phrfsef.com, or Chief Handicapper Christopher Woolsey at info@phrfsef.com or by phone at 954-462-9247.
- 5.3 **Multihull** ocean racing/cruising type boats at least 25 feet LOA minimum with enclosed cabins and permanent accommodations, having submitted a completed entry form and a current valid PHRF Certificate obtained from MASF are invited. The Race Committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not comply with their definition of an "ocean racing/cruising type" Multihull boat. To obtain a rating from MASF, contact MASF at www.masf-multihulls.com.
- 5.4 **IRC** rated boats with a LOA of 30 feet minimum, having submitted a completed entry form, and a valid "Endorsed" 2006 IRC Certificate are invited. *IRC* racing will be offered if sufficient entries are received and satisfactory classes can be established. IRC rating applications for US flagged boats can be obtained through US SAILING (401-683-0800 or *IRC@ussailing.org*). Boats from other nations should consult their rating office or contact www.rorcrating.com. IRC entrants are also required to obtain a 2007 PHRF of Southeast Florida certificate so that PHRF class assignment can be made if there are insufficient IRC entries to form a stand-alone class. In this event, IRC entries may be scored as a separate subclass within a PHRF class.
- 5.5 The ratings and preliminary class assignments of all boats entered in the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at the Lauderdale Yacht Club beginning at 1200 (Noon) on Tuesday, January 9th and remain posted until 1700 the same day, at which time all posted valid ratings will stand for the race.
- 5.7 Boats are required to have a their current valid certificates on board while racing.

6.0 CREW LIMITS

- 6.1 Crew limits for PHRF boats shall be as listed on their current valid certificate plus one.
- 6.2 Crew limits for One-Design Classes shall conform to their Class Rules for sanctioned events plus one.
- 6.3 IRC crew weight and limitations: The maximum total crew weight shall not exceed the product of the Crew Number printed on the boat's certificate, plus one, multiplied by 180 pounds.
- 6.4 All boats, including the Multihull boats shall carry a minimum crew of 4 (four).

7.0 ENTRIES

- 7.1 The entry deadline for the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race shall be Friday, January 5, 2007.
- 7.2 A completed Official Entry Form, a signed waiver form, a copy of the boat's current Official Measurement Certificate and the prescribed entry fee for each boat must be received by the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race Committee at the Lauderdale Yacht Club prior to the final entry deadline.
- 7.3 No entry fee will be refunded after the entry deadline of January 5, 2007.
- 7.4 In consideration of acceptance of his entry, each owner / skipper agrees to be bound by the Racing rules of Sailing and by all the other rules that govern the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race. Each skipper certifies to have read, understand and agree with the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions.
- 7.5 The Race Committee shall have the right to randomly inspect entries for eligibility and equipment requirements at any time prior to the awards presentation.

8.0 ENTRY FEES

8.1 Entry fees to participate in the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race are as follows;

Early entries received or postmarked on or before December 8, 2006 \$ 250.00 US

<u>Entries received after December 8, 2006</u> but before the entry deadline of January 5, 2007

\$ 350.00 US

8.2 The prescribed entry fee must accompany the Official Entry Form.

9.0 CLASSES AND IDENTIFICATION

- 9.1 The fleet may be divided into Classes of IRC, PHRF, One-Design, and Multihull boats, with further Class divisions depending on the number of entries. Class divisions and starting times will be posted on the Official Notice Board at the Lauderdale Yacht Club by 1700 on Tuesday, January 9, 2007.
- 9.2 For Class identification, a colored Class pennant will be issued to each competing boat. The Class Pennant shall be prominently displayed near the stern of the boat.
- 9.3 Scratch sheets will be included in the Skipper's packet distributed prior to the Skipper's Meeting.

10.0 SCORING AND TIME ALLOWANCES

- 10.1 The Low Point Scoring System as described in Appendix "A" Scoring of the RRS will apply.
- 10.2 The course distance for the Fort Lauderdale to Key West Race is established at 160 nautical miles for scoring purposes.
- 10.3 **PHRF** Time Allowances shall be calculated using the Random Leg handicap issued by the PHRF of SE Florida Rating Committee and the rated course distance.
- 10.4 **MASF PHRF** Time Allowances shall be calculated using the handicaps issued by the **MASF** Rating Committee and the rated course distance.
- 10.4 **IRC** division, the boats rating allowance will be applied as a factor of the elapsed time of its race.

11.0 RESPONSIBILITY

- 11.1 The Fort Lauderdale to Key West Race Committee, co-sponsoring clubs and participating commercial sponsors do not accept responsibility for loss of life or injury to participants or others, or for the loss of or damage to any vessel in any way or from any cause during or related to this race.
- 11.2 The safety of a boat and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the *Skipper* who must insure that the boat is fully sound, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by an experienced crew who are physically fit. The *Skipper* of the boat must be satisfied as to the soundness of the hull, spars rigging, sails and all gear. He must insure that all equipment is properly maintained and stowed that he and the crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used. Neither the establishment of regulations nor an inspection of a boat in any way limits and reduces the complete and unlimited responsibility of the *Skipper*.
- 11.3 It is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the *Skipper* of each boat to decide whether or not to start, or continue in the race, and to notify the Race Committee if the boat withdraws after starting the race.

12.0 CONDUCT

12.1 The *Skipper* shall be responsible for the conduct of his crew. In the event of a serious breach of conduct, the destruction of property or the failure to comply with a reasonable request of any Race Officer, committee member, or agent of the Storm Trysail Club or Lauderdale Yacht Club, the Storm Trysail Club or Lauderdale Yacht Club may rescind the entry of the boat and the *Skipper* shall be liable for any and all damages.

13.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

13.0 Preliminary Sailing Instructions will be available on or about December 15, 2006, posted on the Ft. Lauderdale to Key West Race website; www.KeyWestRace.org, and final Sailing Instructions will be available before the Skipper's Meeting on January 9th, 2007 at the Lauderdale Yacht Club.

14.0 SKIPPERS' MEETING

- 14.1 A Skippers' Meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 9, 2007 at 1830 hours at the Lauderdale Yacht Club. It is required that a representative of each boat entered attend the Skippers' Meeting to submit crew lists, and pick up handicap sheets, the appropriate class flag, and race packet.
- 14.2 Each boat shall be required to execute and complete an accurate crew list, equipment declaration and conduct responsibilities form in exchange for their race packet.
- 14.3 Each Skipper or Owner shall indicate the intended location of his or her boat while in Key West. Boats failing to comply may be protested by the Race Committee, and if such a protest is sustained, the boat may be disgualified or assessed an appropriate time penalty.

15.0 PRIZES

15.1 First, second and third place trophies will be awarded the winners in each Class

Committee's Trophy - Presented to the Skipper of the Best Overall Performance boat.

Bolero Trophy – Presented to the Skipper of the First PHRF Boat to Finish.

East Martello Trophy - Presented to the Skipper of the First PHRF Boat (Corrected) to Finish.

Northrup & Johnson Trophy – Presented to the Navigator of the First PHRF Boat (Corrected) to Finish.

Appleton Trophy – Presented to the Skipper of the First IRC Boat to Finish.

IRC Trophy - Presented to the First IRC Boat (Corrected) to Finish

Edward A. Powers Memorial Trophy – Presented to the Navigator of the First IRC Boat (Corrected) to Finish.

Rudy Choy Memorial Award – Presented to the Skipper of the First Multihull Boat to Finish.

Douglas Merrill Memorial Trophy - Presented to the Skipper of the First Multihull Boat (Corrected) to Finish.

Teddy Hall Memorial - Presented to the Skipper of the boat with Best Performance by a STC Member.

Lauderdale Yacht Club Perpetual Trophy - Presented to the Skipper of the boat with <u>Best_Performance by a LYC</u> Member.

Hillsboro Inlet Trophy - Presented to the Skipper of the boat with the <u>Best Performance by a Hillsboro Inlet Sailing Club Member.</u>

Gulfstream Sailing Club Trophy - Presented to the Skipper of the boat with the <u>Best Performance by a Gulfstream Sailing Club Member.</u>

Dowager Trophy – Presented to the Skipper of the boat with the <u>Best Performance By A Boat Over 25 Years Old.</u> **William Cargill Trophy** – May be presented to the Skipper of a boat exhibiting <u>Outstanding Seamanship</u> during the event.
