# Sailing Instructions Saturday, July 11, 2020

#### 1. Rules

- 1.1 The race shall be governed by the rules as defined by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020.
- 1.2 Amendments to these Sailing Instructions shall be posted on the official notice board outside the SHYC clubhouse at least two hours before the start of the race.

# 2. Notice to Competitors

- 2.1 The regatta is open to boats holding a current YRALIS PHRF Certificate and by invitation to others. Invited boats without a current YRALIS PHRF Certificate will be assigned a rating by the Race Committee.
- 2.2 Race Committee broadcasts will be made over VHF channel 71. Competitors will receive VHF radio transmissions from the Race Committee concerning safety, notice of OCS boats and general information to assist in the management of the event.
- 2.3 Boats must compete with a maximum of two crewmembers including the helmsperson.

# 3. Changes to Sailing Instructions

3.1 Any changes to these sailing instructions shall be posted on the official notice board outside the SHYC clubhouse at least two hours before the start of the race.

## 4. Schedule of Race

3.2 There will be one race the first signal for which will be made at 1100.

# 5. Racing Area

3.3 The racing area will be in the vicinity of Red Bell R24 south of Cockenoe Island.

#### 6. Course

6.1 The course will be selected based on wind direction and velocity. Once the course is selected it will be announced over VHF channel 71.

#### 7. Marks

- 7.1 W and X marks shall be yellow tetrahedrons.
- 7.2 R22, R24 and R26 are Red Bell Government Marks

#### 8. Check In

8.1 Before the start each boat will approach the stern of the Committee Boat, declare her intention to start and announce her sail number.

#### 9. The Start

- 9.1 Racing will be started using RRS26 with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal.
- 9.2 The starting line shall be between an orange flag on the RC boat on the starboard end and a pin with an orange flag on the port end.
- 9.3 A series of short sound signals may be made before the sequence begins in order to attract attention.

# 10. Postponement

10.1 The Answering Pennant (AP) will be flown to indicate a postponement along with two sound signals. The warning signal will be made one minute after removal of the AP.

#### 11. Recalls

11.1 When an individual recall is signaled, the RC may attempt to hail boat(s) that are OCS.

### 12. The Finish

- 12.1 The finish line will be between the orange flag on the committee boat at the port end of the line and the yellow tetrahedron "X" on the starboard end of the line.
- 12.2 The race may be shortened at any mark of the course. If so, the committee boat may be stationed on either side of the finish mark. All, boats shall finish in a direction from the previous turning mark.

# 13. Scoring

13.1 Corrected times will be calculated using PHRF Time-on-Time scoring.

# 14. Disclaimer of Liability

14.1 Competitors participate entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the race.
