2. RULES

2.1. Each event NOR will define.

3. ADVERTISING

3.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

4. ELIGIBILITY

4.1. The Cup Series is open to all boats of the International Melges 24 Class.

5. ENTRY

5.1. The entry fee is \$10.00.

5.2. Boats shall register and pay for each event they participate in included within the Cup Series, using the registration system described in the NOR for each event. Registration is not required for events that teams do not participate at, in order to be included on the Cup Series.

5.3. Every boat competing in the Cup Series shall be identified by the name of the current Melges 24 Owner of the boat racing. If the entrant is a Charterer, that boat shall be identified by the name of the Charterer. Other recognition components include: 1) Bow number); 2) Sail number; 3) Helmsman, and 4) Boat Name.

6. CLASSIFICATION, FEES, SCHEDULE, MEASUREMENTS, SAILING INSTRUCTIONS, VENUE, THE COURSES, PENALTY SYSTEM, SUPPORT BOATS, BERTHING, HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS, DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS, RADIO COMMUNICATION, AND INSURANCE.

6.1 Each event NOR will define.

7. SCORING

7.1 For the results of the Cup Series:

- A high-point scoring system will be used where the boat accumulating the most points wins
- A boat's final score for each regatta will be based on a 100-point scale, inverted. For example, if a boat wins a 25-boat regatta the winner will be awarded 100 pts., second place will earn 99 pts., and so on.
- A boat attending an event and scored DNC will be scored 0 pts.
- A boat not attending an event will receive 0 pts.
- The ranking of the Cup Series will be calculated by adding a boat's best three individual event scores. A boat attending four or five events will be allowed throw outs.

8. PRIZES

8.1. The winner of the Cup Series will be awarded the right to hold the Cup Series perpetual trophy until the conclusion of the following year's Cup Series.

9. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

9.1 Competitors participate in the Cup Series entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the Cup Series.
