

NOTICE OF RACE DAILY CRUISE SERIES July 25th – 31st, 2020

Rules

Competition will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing, including the US Sailing Prescriptions; the current PHRF regulations, as administered by the YRA of Long Island Sound (YRALIS); and the Minimum Equipment Recommendations of the YRALIS (Category C); except as any of these are changed by this Notice of Race and by the Sailing Instructions.

Autopilots and powered winches are permitted. This modifies rule 52.

Ratings

Each yacht must have an appropriate PHRF certificate from the YRA of LIS or comparable evidence of their rating. Weight and crew limits as pertaining to PHRF certificates will be waived for the series. Ratings will be based on non-spinnaker and spinnaker distance PHRF ratings issued by the YRA of LIS. If you do not have a rating, you can apply to the AYC measurer to receive one. These ratings may be modified by the AYC measurer.

Divisions

Division assignments will be made by the Race Committee based on the number of entries received.

Schedule

One race per day is scheduled:

Sunday, July 26th – Newport to Vineyard Haven Monday, July 27th – Vineyard Haven to Nantucket

Tuesday, July 28th - Lay day, no racing

Wednesday, July 29th – Nantucket to Edgartown Thursday, July 30th – Edgartown to Padanaram Friday, July 31st – Padanaram to Newport

Prizes

Perpetual trophies for the series may include:

- Commodore Edgar Palmer Memorial Trophy
- Commodore Frank R. Lawrence Memorial Trophy
- Frank J. Gould Trophy
- Commodore Eric W. Peniston Trophy- Best overall performance of a member's yacht

The "Nooner" prize may be awarded, at the discretion of the Race Committee, to the yacht that has shown an outstanding sense of humor, ingenuity, fair play or sportsmanship.

Rules Special written and oral changes may be made as described below under **Notices**.

Autopilots and powered winches are permitted. This modifies RRS 52.

Safety Yachts must be seaworthy and carry appropriate safety equipment, including a radio

capable of using VHF Channels 16 and 71. At least 2 able-bodied persons must be on board

during a race.

Captain's Meeting

The meeting may be held in Newport at 5:30 on Saturday, July 25th and will also be announced on Channel 71.

Entries/Ratings

See Notice of Race. Division assignments will be announced at the captains' meeting and will be e-mailed to the cruising distribution list.

Notices All skippers are responsible for listening to the Morning Announcements on Channel 71

each race day, at the Attention Signal, and on the hour during races.

Oral changes may be given on the water on Channel 71 by the Race Committee.

Courses & Schedule

In the event of light or contrary breeze the race committee may direct the fleet to motor to a designated mark of the course. Such designated marks are defined in each of the daily courses defined below.

Daily Cruise Series

One race per day is scheduled.

Sunday, July 26 - Newport to Vineyard Haven

<u>Course</u> (Total Distance of 37.0 NM) – The start will be at Red whistle "2" Q R Whistle left to port. The first mark will be red bell "32" south of Cuttyhunk, keeping to port, then on to finish at red gong "2" north of West Chop. Interim marks red light "30", green light "29" and green bell "27" all kept to starboard.

Caution – The Race course keeps Lucas and Middle Ground Shoals to starboard. Vessels with deep drafts are advised to steer clear.

Monday, July 27 – Vineyard Haven to Nantucket

<u>Course</u> (Total Distance of 24.2 NM) – The start is green bell "23" off East Chop to green can "21A" left to starboard, green can "5" north of Norton Shoal; green can "3" north of

Tuckernut Shoal; then on to green bell "1" (leaving to starboard) and on to finish at redwhite bell "NB". All marks kept to starboard.

Tuesday, July 28 – Lay day, no racing Wednesday, July 29 – Nantucket to Edgartown

<u>Course</u> (Total Distance of 20.6 NM) – The start mark is Red-White bell "NB" left to port, then to green bell "1" off Nantucket Harbor Entrance to green can "3" north of Tuckernut Shoal (left to port); green can "5" north of Norton Shoal (left to port); green can "21A" north of Hawes Shoal (left to port); then on to finish at green can "3" west of Cape Poge Flats (leaving to port) in Edgartown's Outer Harbor.

Thursday, July 30 - Edgartown to Padanaram

<u>Course</u> (Total Distance of 24.4 NM) – The start mark is red bell "2" north of Allen Rock is left to port, on to green bell "23" off East Chop, then red gong "2" of West Chop; to green bell "27" north of west end of Middle Ground Shoal; to green bell "1" marking entrance to Quicks Hole, keeping it to starboard. Keep Quicks Hole marks red light "2" to starboard and green can "3" to port. Next mark is green-red light "L-R" on other side of Quicks Hole. Finish will be between red bell "8" and red nun "8A" west of Great Ledge. Except where noted, all marks kept to port.

Caution – Be mindful of commercial traffic entering and leaving Vineyard Haven.

Friday, July 31 – Padanaram to Newport

(Total Distance of 21.5 NM) – The start mark is green "7" light south of Wilkes Ledge left to starboard; to green gong "5" south of Mirshaum Ledge; to green can 1 south of The Wildcat; to red bell "2" south of Sakonnet Point; and on to finish at red whistle "2" Q R Whistle south of Brenton Reef. All marks kept to starboard.

Start/Finish

Each yacht shall start within the Start Open window by taking their time as they pass the starting mark designated in the course instructions bearing (+/-) 90 degrees from the course to the next mark. Each yacht shall finish the race by passing the last mark in the course on the side designated in the course instructions when they reach (+/-) 90 degrees of that course to the mark. If a yacht does not start before the window closes their time will be calculated from the actual time the window closes until their finish at the final mark. Your distance from either the start or finish mark must be at most 100 Yards unless that is compromised by either other boats or the sea conditions.

Abandonment

Will be signaled on the radio by the race committee and sent to the AYC fleet via an email

Withdrawal A yacht departing the squadron or withdrawing from any race shall notify the race

committee as soon as possible on Channel 71 or e-mailed to the cruising distribution list

Time Limit For the Daily Cruise Series, a time limit, in terms of elapsed hours, may be posted at the

start. Yachts unable to finish within the prescribed time will be scored TLE. The race committee will broadcast on Channel 71 and e-mailed to the cruising distribution list

shortly after each time limit expires.

Protests Protests must be delivered in writing to the race committee within 1 hour after the race

committee arrives in port. The protest committee may elect to hear protests after the

fleet returns to Rye. Decisions of the protest committee will be final.

Scoring The Daily Cruise Series will be scored using the Low Point scoring system of Appendix A,

modified as follows:

Each boat finishing in a race and not thereafter retiring or being disqualified will be scored points equal to her finishing place. A boat that does not compete will not be scored one point more than the *number of boats competing in the series*. A boat scored as TLE shall receive one point more than the *number of finishers in that race*. All other boats, including a boat that finishes but thereafter retires or is disqualified, will be scored one point more than the *number of starters in that race*. Five races are scheduled for the Daily Cruise Series of which one must be completed to constitute a series. When fewer than 4 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 4 or more races are completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score, i.e. one throw-out will be allowed.
