SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing and the current PHRF-LE Class Rules.

2 ENTRIES

All boats that have submitted applications accepted by the Race Committee and have paid the proper entry fee are eligible to race.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS AND CLASS SPLITS

Notices to competitors and class splits for Saturday's and Sundays morning will be posted on the official notice board located on a window at the patio of the BYC Porter Avenue clubhouse and the unofficial notice board at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=11771.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located at BYC. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 1 (one) hour after AP is lowered.

5 SCHEDULE

The warning signal for the first race will be 11:00 AM both days. 3 races may be run on Saturday. One race on Sunday.

The starting sequence for <u>Saturday and Sunday</u> is:

A boat not starting within 5 minutes of the last start will be scored 'DNC'. This changes rule A4.

6 CLASS FLAGS (Class flags are not required to be displayed on boats racing).

7 STARTING AREA

The Starting area Saturday and Sunday will be located in the vicinity of the BHSC marks W or A.

8 COURSE and MARKS


8.1 COURSE NOTICATION

Courses will be displayed from the stern of the signal vessel. There may be different courses for different classes. The courses may be announced each morning on VHF ch. 79. at or within 10 minutes prior to the warning signal of the first start of the first class.

8.2 SATURDAY COURSE DESCRIPTION

Saturday's races will be either;

- A triangle or a triangle then windward and leeward course consisting of all dropped marks. The Triangle
 course will be displayed from the signal vessel as T (start, round marks T and V, finish). The triangle
 then windward/leeward course will be displayed as TWL (start, round marks T,V,X,T,finish). The
 approximate distance and compass heading to the first weather mark will be posted on the signal vessel
 for Saturday's courses.
- 2. A course using a series of Fixed and Dropped marks to be rounded as displayed from the stern of the RC signal vessel. In the event the T mark is used as a weather mark, the R/C Signal Vessel shall display the distance and heading to T from the stern or the side of the Signal Vessel.
 When a mark of the course is displayed in black with a white background leave the mark to port. When a mark of the course is displayed in white with a green background leave the mark to starboard.



8.3 CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

The race committee will place a new mark (orange inflatable) to change the next leg of the course. They will remove the original mark as soon as practical.


8.4 SUNDAY COURSE DESCRIPTION

Sunday's course will have a course using a series of marks to be rounded as displayed from the stern of the RC signal vessel. In the event the T mark is used as a weather mark, the R/C Signal Vessel shall display the distance and heading to T from the stern or the side of the Signal Vessel.

When a mark of the course is displayed in black with a white background leave the mark to port. When a mark of the course is displayed in white with a green background leave the mark to starboard.

The following diagrams show the Saturday and Sunday marks and their approximate locations.

9 STARTING AND FINISHING LINES

The starting line for both days will be between the RC Flagstaff on the Signal vessel and the weather most part of Mark O (orange tetrahedron) for T or TWL courses. The start line for courses displayed as a series of letters will be between the RC Flagstaff and the weather side of the first mark displayed. The finish line for T and TWL courses on Saturday will be in the same location as the start line. The Finish line for courses displayed as a series of letters on Saturday and Sunday will be between the RC Flagstaff on the Signal vessel and the last mark displayed on the course board.

When Z is displayed as the last mark of the course, the finish line will be between Green G13 and Red R14 directly in front of the BYC Buffalo station. As boats approach the Buffalo shoreline and are about to enter the Black Rock Channel, they are required to leave navigation marks G1 ($42^{\circ}53.065'$ N $78^{\circ}53.589'$ W) and G3 ($42^{\circ}53.168'$ N $78^{\circ}53.570'$ W) to port, as well as, pass the proper side of all navigation marks in the Black Rock Channel to the BYC.

10 TIME LIMIT

The time limit per race on Saturday will be 2 hours, after that class starts, for the first boat to finish in their class on Saturday. Boats finishing more than 30 minutes after the first boat of their class finishes will be scored DNF without a hearing. The time limit on Sunday will be 4:30 in the afternoon. Any boat finishing after 4:30 PM on Sunday will be scored DNF without a hearing regardless of class time limits. This changes RRS 35, 63.1, A4 and A5.

11 PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1 PENALTY AT THE TIME OF AN INCIDENT

The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or rule 31 in an incident while racing. However, when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.'

11.2 PENALTY TAKEN AFTER A RACE

After a race, a boat that may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or rule 31 in an incident while racing may take a Post-Race Penalty for that incident. A boat takes the penalty by delivering a written notice to the race office that identifies the race number and when and where the incident occurred. The penalty shall be a 30% Scoring Penalty, calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c). However, rules 44.1(a) and (b) apply, and the penalty shall not be taken after a protest hearing involving the incident has begun.

12 PROTESTS

Protests shall be delivered to Race Committee within 1 (one) hour after the race committee's finish vessel docks or the last boat finishes, whichever is later. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing each day in the BYC Clubhouse.

13 SCORING

- 13.1 All scores will count. Each day's racing is a separate event and will be scored as such.
- 13.2 Scoring will be done using the time on distance procedure.
- 13.3 When each day's race(s) is (are) completed, the completed race(s) will constitute that day's regatta.
- 13.4 Only a completed race will constitute a regatta.
- 13.5 The Low Point System shall be used in determining finishing scores:

Trophies will be awarded for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} place finishes per day. Saturday's trophies will be based on the combined score of all Saturday races.
