



2021 LORC PCYC Open Saturday, July 3rd and Sunday, July 4th Port Credit Yacht Club Mississauga, Ontario

NOTICE OF RACE

Given the fluidity of the situation around COVID 19 that may extend to cover this event, the LORC PCYC Open may need to make adjustments to protect the health and well being of racers, volunteers, and others. This may include limits on the number of sailboats and/or crew numbers, whether by sailboat or in total.

These will be done as amendments to the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions and posted on the Official Notice Board.

The Lake Ontario Racing Council (LORC) and Port Credit Yacht Club (PCYC) are the organizing authority (OA) for this Event.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Sail Canada, available at <u>https://www.sailing.ca/uploads/2020/10/Sail-Canada-Prescriptions-to-the-RRS_2021-2024.pdf</u> will apply.
- 1.3 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available as of 1200 Tuesday, June 29th at <u>https://yachtscoring.com</u>.
- 2.2 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions (SIs) and Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSIs) that will be posted on the official notice board at noon on Thursday, July 1st.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board will be located at <u>https://yachtscoring.com</u>.
- 3.2 [DP] All boats must carry a VHF radio that is equipped with working VHF transmitter/receiver supporting Canadian frequencies of 6, 9, 16, 68, 71, 72 and 73.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SSIs.

3.4 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILTY, ENTRY AND WAIVER

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats as follows: Handicap Fleets: PHRF Melges 24 One Design Fleets: 8mR Beneteau 36.7 Melges 32 Etchells J105s
- 4.2 A minimum of five (5) boats makes a class.
- 4.3 Boats competing must:
 - 4.3.1 Have proof of membership in compliance with RRS 75.
 - 4.3.2 Comply with the applicable equipment requirement of government agencies in her country of registration.
- 4.4 The OA reserves the right to keep like boats together, even if this action overrides one or more boat's separation by rating. In case of an assignment of a boat to a Class outside of her rating band, the owner shall be notified by email.
- 4.5 While racing, the boat shall carry a minimum of a skipper and one crew member, expect where a different number is required by the relevant one-design class rule or when the event has a single-handed class.
- 4.6 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.7 Registration may be limited dependent upon the COVID restrictions and practices at the time of the event.

5 FEES*

- 5.1 All boats \$120 (*) HST is levied on these fees
- 5.2 If the event is cancelled, other than for weather, the fees less administration cost will be refunded.

6 SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Racing will be held on Saturday, July 3rd and Sunday, July 4th.
- 6.2 The warning signal each day will be at 1050.
- 6.3 No race will be started after 1500 each day.
- 6.4 A maximum of 4 races will be held on Saturday and a maximum of 3 races will be held on Sunday. For the *8 Metre class*, a maximum of 3 races are scheduled for Saturday and a maximum of 2 races are scheduled on Sunday.

7 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

7.1 Each boat racing in PHRF divisions shall produce or verify the existence of a valid PHRF-LO certificate.

8 VENUE

8.1 Racing will take place on Lake Ontario south and east of the entrance to the Port Credit Yacht Club basin.

9 COURSES

- 9.1 The course will be a windward/leeward course.
- 9.2 The co-ordinates of the course locations will be provided in the SIs.

10 PENALTY SYSTEM

10.1 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.

11 SCORING

- 11.1 PHRF fleets will be scored using the PHRF-LO Time on Time scoring system.
- 11.2 One race will constitute a series.
- 11.3 A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.

13 RISK STATEMENT

- 13.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
- 13.2 Competitors voluntarily assume the risks associated with communicable diseases including but not limited to COVID 19.

14 INSURANCE

14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance policy with a minimum coverage of \$2,000,000 CAD per event for Canadian boats and \$350,000 USD for US boats. A copy of the policy shall be kept on board the boat.

15 PRIZES

- 15.1 Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd for each division.
- 15.2 Additional prizes may be awarded.
- 15.3 There will not be an awards ceremony. Prizes will be forwarded to the winners by mail.

16 MEDIA RIGHTS

16.1 All pictures, audio and video recordings, graphic logos and service names contained herein or produced during the race by or on behalf of the Organizing Authority or Port Credit Yacht Club, are the property of either the Organizing Authority or Port Credit Yacht Club or their respective members. No rights are granted to use pictures, graphic logos, and service names without permission. Registrants, competitors, and participants grant the Organizing Authority or Port Credit Yacht Club (PCYC) the unrestricted right and permission to use the name and/or image for any text, photograph, or video footage of either themselves or the sailboat they are sailing during the event to be published or broadcast in any media whatsoever (including but not limited to press, TV advertisements, social media or internet), for either editorial or advertising purposes or to be used in press information.
