Date: Sunday, September 26, 2021

Organizing Authority: Milford Yacht Club (MYC) in conjunction with the Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association

(ECSA).

Rules: Racing will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024 (RRS)*, the prescriptions

of the United States Sailing Association, and the 2018 Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association

Rules, as amended by this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.

Entries & Eligibility: Boats must have a valid 2021 PHRF-ECSA certificate. Yachts must have self-bailing cockpits,

fixed berths, galley facilities, and the ability to be self-supporting for a weekend cruise. Enter

by going to www.yachtscoring.com to register.

Entry Fee: Fee is \$50 for US Sailing member; \$55 for non-US Sailing member.

Party: There will be no charge for the party at MYC following the race.

Deadline: Saturday, September 25, 2021 at 1700.

Schedule: There will be no more than two races with the First Warning signal no earlier than 1200.

Start/Finish: The racing area will be held in an area about 1 nm south of Charles Island, Milford, CT.

Notice to Competitors: Changes in the NOR and Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board outside

the Dockmaster's office at MYC by 0900 the day of the race; SIs and Scratch Sheets may be

posted on www.yachtscoring.com 24 hours before the First Warning.

Signals Made Ashore: Signals made ashore will be displayed from a flagpole adjacent to the Dockmaster's office at

MYC.

Classes: Entries will be divided into classes considering PHRF ratings, the number of entrants, and the

types of vessels entered. Spinnaker, non-spinnaker, and one-design classes are offered and encouraged. Those interested in one-design classes should contact the MYC Fleet Captain.

Courses & Marks: Courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions; marks may be a combination of inflatable

and government marks.

Scoring: Races will be scored using a PHRF based "time-on-time" system. The Low Point Scoring System

will be used to determine the places for boats in each class. If one-design classes compete in the MYC Last Chance and the WSC Last Chance they shall have both days scored for a series.

Two races shall constitute a series.

Results & Prizes: Results will be posted at the post-race party. Prizes will be awarded at the Windjammers

Sailing Club banquet at the end of the season. One-design classes who compete in the MYC Last Chance and the WSC Last Chance they shall have both days scored for a series. Two races

shall constitute a series.

Facilities: Dockage space, as available on Friday and Saturday nights, will be provided at no extra cost to

competing yachts who REQUEST DOCKAGE ON THEIR ENTRY FORM. Expect some rafting. Dock
