Notice of Race (NoR)

RULES

The event is governed by the *Rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, copies of which can be found <u>here</u>.

COMMUNICATION

On the water, the race committee will monitor a VHF channel to be stated in the SI.

[DP] While racing, except in emergency, boats shall not make voice or data transmissions and shallnot receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

This event is open to all boats with or without valid WFPHRF certificates.

Those with valid certificates will be entered into the appropriate class below, based on certificate endorsements:

Spinnaker Non-spinnaker Racer-cruiser Cruiser (spin or non-spin) Doublehand Singlehand

Those without valid certificates will be entered into the class Mother Load and will be assigned handicap ratings by the Organizing Authority.

Classes may be combined or sub-divided based on participation.

To enter a boat, log on to <u>www.yachtscoring.com</u> and select 2022 February 5th TSS Gasparilla Regatta. Onsite entries are not available.

FEES

Entry fees include [2] Saturday dinner tickets, [2] Saturday party wristbands, [1] event shirt, and up to [4] Mount Gay Rum Caps (number may be adjusted based on participation and crew numbers).

\$65 prior to Monday, January 31, 2022

\$70 after that

\$15 each additional party ticket

\$10 each additional dinner ticket

\$18 each additional shirt

Entered boats that withdraw on or prior to January 28, 2022, will receive a refund of their entryfee, less a \$25 administrative charge. Boats withdrawing after that will not be eligible for refund, if the event takes place.

CREW LIMITATIONS

Entrants in the Double Hand Class are limited to two people on board. Entrants into the Single Hand Class are limited to one person aboard.

Monday, January 31, 2022

Monday, January 31, 2022, will be GO/NO-GO decision day based on any changes in the COVID restrictions which would impede or prevent the event. If that happens, all entrants will receive a refund of their fees, less a \$25 administrative charge.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

SI will be available by Friday, January 28, 2022, at <u>www.yachtscoring.com</u> and <u>www.sail-tss.org</u> and on the official regatta bulletin board at TSS adjacent to the flagpole.

VENUE

Tampa Bay, primarily between Apollo Beach and the boundary shipping channels on the north and west sides of the bay. Start/finish area approximately 2.0 nm off TSS, on east side of bay.

COURSES

The Short Course (SC) is a Windward/Leeward course on drop marks. Distance between 0.5 and 2.0 nm depending on wind.

The Long Course (LC) is a Random Leg course with a windward (0.25 nm) first leg. Total courselength will be approximately 5, 10, 15, or 20 nm, depending on wind conditions.

Each course will have its own starting area and Race Committee. When checking in on the water, boats should make sure they are at the right starting area for their Class.

Singlehand, Doublehand, Mother Load, and Cruisers will sail the Long Course with a pursuit start and should stay well clear of the immediate starting area until 5 minutes or less before they are timed to start.

Racer-Cruisers and will sail the Long Course with a flag start.

Spin and Non-spin will sail the Short Course (W/L) with a flag start.

OA may shift one or more Classes over to pursuit starts too if needed in response to conditions.

SCORING

A boat's regatta score will be the total of her race scores.

[1] race is required to constitute a regatta in each Class.

PENALTY SYSTEM

For Mother Load, Cruisers, Racer/Cruisers, Double Hands, and Single Hands, all TURNS penalties are replaced with a Scoring Penalty of 20%. This changes RRS Rule 44.1. Spin and Non-Spin remain unchanged.

To accept a penalty, boats must promptly display a yellow flag and call the Race Committee's attention to it upon finishing.

BERTHING

[DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places.

RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma,

hypothermia or other causes, including potential exposure to infectious disease, notably Covid-19.

PRIZES

Racing trophies will be awarded for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} placement in each Class. Bottles of Mount Gay XO to the 1^{st} place winners in each Class.

End of NoR

NOTES

The annotation [DP] appears before some elements both in the above NoR and in the ensuing SI. It means Discretionary Penalty. The NoR and SI are considered *Rules* by the *Racing Rules of Sailing* which means that infraction of any element of either must result in Disqualification, DSQ. However, with elements annotated [DP], the Protest Committee may assign a penalty less than DSQ.
