Notice Of Race

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the 2021 2024 Racing Rules of Sailing, the attached waiver and release of liability, and the attached official entry form.
- 1.2 Racing Rules of Sailing Part 4 preamble and RRS 40 will be changed as follows: When flag Y is displayed ashore, all competitors and crew shall wear personal buoyancy at all times while afloat except for brief periods (two 2 minutes or less) while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Racing rule A2 will be changed to provide one discard with four (4) or more completed races, if fewer than four (4) races are completed there will be no discards. Racing rule A5 will be changed as follows: A boat starting later than ten (10) minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. Racing Rule 32 will be changed as follows: Races will not be shortened. Racing rules 35 and A5.3 will be changed as follows: Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat finishes, or after the time limit, whichever is later, will be scored "did not finish" (time limit expired). These changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions.

All yachts must register online. Registration closes at 0930 on Friday, August 26th.

2. ADVERTISING

Advertising will be restricted to Category A as stated in ISAF Regulation 20.

3. ENTRY FEE

The CCYRA International Championship Regatta entry fee will be \$250.00. (all skipper and crew meals are included). The registration fee provides for 3 days of racing (weather permitting), a continental breakfast all three days, cookout Thursday, dinner Friday and Saturday and lunch all

three days. Regatta trophies will be awarded to the top five finishers. This fee includes the \$10 assessment for the Comet Class as required in the handbook Appendix I.

4. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- **4.1** All yachts must register online. Registration closes at 10:00 AM on Thursday, August 25th.
- 4.2 Entries received after August 12th will be subject to an additional fee of \$50.

6.2 Because more than one race or sequence of races will be held on the same day, a YELLOW flag will be displayed at the finish when another race is to follow the same day, and the warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable. After a long postponement (ten minutes or more), a day's prior race, and/or the lunch break, to alert boats that a race will begin soon, the ORANGE line flag will be displayed (with one sound) at least four minutes before a warning signal is displayed.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available no later than 4:00 PM on August 25, 2022. And at registration.

8. VENUE

South Shrewsbury River

9. THE COURSE

The courses shall be Olympic courses (triangle-windward-leeward-windward) or Windward-Leeward.

10. SCORING

- **10.1** RRS A2 will apply as modified in 1.2 above.
- **10.2** The number of scheduled races is 7 of which 3 must be completed to constitute the regatta. Should wind, weather, or other conditions make it impossible or impractical to complete all seven (7) races within the publicized time, the event will be terminated and the results based upon the completed number of races.
- 10.3 No race shall be declared official unless three or more entrants come to the starting line.

11. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

12. REQUIRED SAFETY EQUIPMENT

Paddle, Anchor 4 lbs with 50 ft. line & PFD

12.1 US Competitors shall carry a U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) approved personal floatation device (PFD). Competitors from outside the U.S. shall carry a PFD approved by their nations' certification authority to the extent permitted by international treaty.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in

this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

14. PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

- 14.1 No competitor shall use, either on or off the water: marijuana or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 U.S. Code 802) the possession of which is unlawful under 21 U.S. Code 841. No competitor, member of the race committee, or member of the safety patrol shall use alcohol during the event until after each day's scores become final and each day's protests, if any, decided. The consumption of alcohol by competitors under age 21 is strictly prohibited both on and off the water during the entire event.
- 14.2 An alleged breach of one of these regulations shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when the protest committee believes that a competitor may have breached one of these regulations, it shall follow the process described in racing rule 69.1 and a competitor found to have breached one of these regulations shall be excluded from the remaining races in the series, and where practical removed from the regatta venue and sent home. The competitor's boat shall be disqualified from all races of the series.
