SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

1. RULES

See Notice of Race 1.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted by 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB) located online at www.yachtscoring.com.
- 3.2 The Race Committee (RC) intends to broadcast race information and course information by VHF Ch 05 and repeat on the Event Telegram group. See Addendum B.
- 3.3 On each racing day, the RC will provide a morning briefing by VHF and Telegram at 0900.
- 3.4 Competitors wishing to communicate with the RC should do so on VHF Ch 77.

4. CODE OF CONDUCT

4.1 Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE AND AFLOAT

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the RYS Flagstaff and advised on the event Telegram group.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced by "not less than 45 minutes". This changes Race Signals AP.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 See Notice of Race 9.
- 6.2 To alert that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with multiple sound signals at least 5 minutes before the warning signal.

7. CLASS FLAGS

The class flags are.

Open Division	Naval Numeral Two 
Classic Division	Naval Numeral Six 

8. RACING AREA

8.1 Racing will take place from a Committee Vessel (CV) in the Central and Eastern Solent.

9. COURSES

- 9.1 The courses to be sailed will be a windward / leeward configuration as described in Addendum A.
- 9.2 If only a single windward or leeward mark is present, boats shall leave that mark to port before proceeding to the next mark of the course.
- 9.3 Soon after the orange flag attention signal is displayed, and before the warning signal, the RC signal vessel will display the approximate bearing and distance to Mark 1. The course signal, compass bearing and distance to Mark 1 will also be announced on VHF.
- 9.4 In cross-tide wind conditions, after the first leg, subsequent legs of the course may be 'walked' down tide to achieve reasonable leeward or windward legs.
- (a) Flag W will be displayed at or before the warning signal for a race where the course will be 'walked' down tide.
- (b) When flag W has been displayed, no course changes (using flag C) or new marks will be used except when the leg length is being increased or decreased or the course is changed for a wind shift. This changes RRS Race Signals and RRS 33.

10. MARKS

- 10.1 With reference to Addendum A, marks 1, 1a, 4s & 4p will be orange inflatable marks.
- 10.2 The starting mark and the finishing mark will be a black inflatable mark.
- 10.3 Change marks will be black marks.
- 10.4 A RC vessel positioned near a mark may display a flag showing the colour of the next mark, except for the final leg to the finish line.

11. OBSTRUCTIONS

- 11.1 All yachts shall comply with [Associated British Ports Notice to Mariners No 06 of 2023](#) giving details of a Precautionary Area and Moving Prohibited Zone (MPZ). The MPZ shall rank as an obstruction for the purposes of RRS 19 and 20.
- 11.2 Any official boat in close attendance to a craft in difficulty is an obstruction.

12. THE START

- 12.1 The start line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the CV and the course side of the starting mark.
- 12.2 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the RC will attempt to broadcast her sail number on VHF Ch 05. Failure to broadcast her number, failure of her to hear such a broadcast, or the order in which boats are broadcast will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 12.3 A boat that does not start within five (5) minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

13. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 13.1 When a change of the next leg of the course has been signalled, the RC will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 13.2 The RC will announce details of any change under SI 13.1 using VHF Ch 05. Failure of a boat to hear such an announcement, will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 13.3 The position of any mark(s) may be adjusted by up to plus or minus 10 degrees relative to previous location and up to approximately 200 metres to windward or leeward without signalling Flag C, a direction signal, a length signal, a sound signal or announcement using VHF. This changes RRS 33.

14. THE FINISH

- 14.1 The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the CV and the course side of the finishing mark.

15. PENALTY SYSTEM

See Notice of Race 14.

16. TIME LIMITS

- 16.1 The Mark 1 Time Limit, Race Time Limit (see RRS 35), Finishing Window and the Target Time are shown in the table below.

Mark 1 Time Limit	Race Time Limit	Finishing Window	Target Race Time
Open Division 50 mins. Classic Division 60 mins.	150 mins	30 mins	75 mins

- 16.2 If no boat has passed the first mark within the Mark 1 Time Limit, or if no boat has finished within the Race Time Limit, the race will be abandoned.

- 16.3 The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, and not subsequently retiring, penalized or given redress, will be scored TLE without a hearing. A boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the finishing place two more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within the Finishing Window. This changes RRS 35, A5.1, A5.2 and A10.

- 16.4 Failure to meet the Target Time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

17. HEARING REQUESTS

- 17.1 The protest limit is 90 minutes after the last boat in their division has finished the last race of the day or the RC signals no more racing today, whichever is later. This time will be posted on the ONB.
- 17.2 Hearing request forms will be available from the Race Office at Cowes Yacht Haven (CYH).
- 17.3 Contact mobile phone numbers should be included on the protest form.
- 17.4 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of the hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 17.5 Hearings will be held in the protest room located at the RYS, beginning at the time posted.

18. SCORING

See Notice of Race 15.

19. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 19.1 [DP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC at the first reasonable opportunity on VHF Ch 77 or by hailing an official vessel.

20. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 20.1 Substitution of competitors is not allowed without the prior written permission of the RC.
- 20.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment is not allowed unless authorised in writing by the RC. Requests for substitution shall be made to the RC at the first reasonable opportunity, which may be after the race.

21. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 21.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, notice of race and sailing instructions.

22. SUPPLIED BOATS

Not used.

23. OFFICIAL VESSELS

- 23.1 Mark laying vessels will be RYS RIBs.
- 23.2 The CV will be a 10m blue hulled motor catamaran – Call Sign Castle Two.

24. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

See Notice of Race 16.

25. TRASH DISPOSAL

25.1 Trash may be placed aboard official or support person vessels.

26. BERTHING

See Notice of Race 18.

27. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

See Notice of Race 19.

28. DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

29. PRIZES

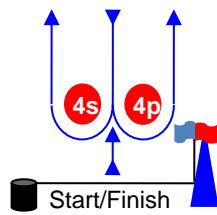
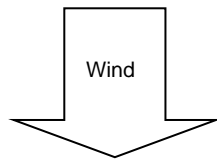
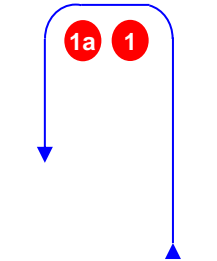

Course Illustrations – Windward Leeward

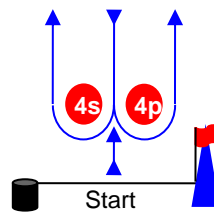
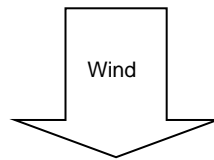
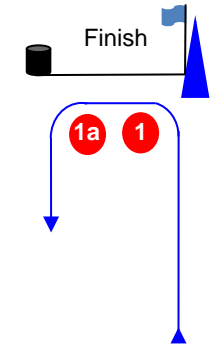

LA 4	Start – 1 – 1a – 4s/4p – 1 – 1a – 4s/4p – 1 – 1a – 4s/4p – 1 – 1a – Finish.
