Part 2 WHEN BOATS MEET

The rules of Part 2 apply between boats that are sailing in or near the racing area and intend to <u>race</u>, are <u>racing</u>, or have been <u>racing</u>. However, a boat not <u>racing</u> shall not be penalized for breaking one of these rules, except rule <u>14</u> when the incident resulted in injury or serious damage, or rule <u>23.1</u>.

When a boat sailing under these rules meets a vessel that is not, she shall comply with the <u>International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea</u> (IRPCAS) or government right-of-way rules. If the notice of race so state, the rules of Part 2 are replaced by the right-of-way rules of the IRPCAS or by government right-of-way rules.

Section A RIGHT OF WAY

A boat has right of way over another boat when the other boat is required to <u>keep clear</u> of her. However, some rules in Sections B, C and D limit the actions of a right-of-way boat.

10. ON OPPOSITE TACKS

When are on opposite *tacks*, a *port-tack* boat shall *keep clear* of a *starboard-tack* boat.

11. ON THE SAME TACK, OVERLAPPED

When boats are on the same *tack* and *overlapped*, a *windward* boat shall *keep clear* of a *leeward* boat.

12. ON THE SAME TACK, NOT OVERLAPPED

When boats are on the same *tack* and not *overlapped*, a boat *clear astern* shall *keep clear* of a boat *clear ahead*.

13. WHILE TACKING

After a boat passes head to wind, she shall <u>keep clear</u> of other boats until she is on a close-hauled course. During that time rules <u>10</u>, <u>11</u> and <u>12</u> do not apply. If two boats are subject to this rule at the same time, the one on the other's port side or the one astern shall <u>keep clear</u>.

Section B GENERAL LIMITATIONS

14. AVOIDING CONTACT

A boat shall avoid contact with another boat if reasonably possible. However, a right-of-way boat or one sailing within the <u>room</u> or <u>mark-room</u> to which she is entitled need not act to avoid contact until it is clear that the other boat is not <u>keeping clear</u> or giving <u>room</u> or <u>mark-room</u>.

15. ACQUIRING RIGHT OF WAY

When a boat acquires right of way, she shall initially give the other boat <u>room</u> to <u>keep clear</u>, unless she acquires right of way because of the other boat's actions.

16. CHANGING COURSE

16.1.

When a right-of-way boat changes course, she shall give the other boat *room* to keep clear.

16.2.

In addition, on a beat to windward when a *port-tack* boat is *keeping clear* by sailing to pass to leeward of a *starboard-tack* boat, the *starboard-tack* boat shall not bear away if as a result the *port-*

tack boat must change course immediately to continue keeping clear.

17. ON THE SAME TACK; PROPER COURSE

If a boat <u>clear astern</u> becomes <u>overlapped</u> within two of her hull lengths to <u>leeward</u> of a boat on the same tack, she shall not sail above her <u>proper course</u> while they remain on the same <u>tack</u> and <u>overlapped</u> within that distance, unless in doing so she promptly sails astern of the other boat. This rule does not apply if the <u>overlap</u> begins while the <u>windward</u> boat is required by rule <u>13</u> to <u>keep clear</u>.
