Notice of Race (NoR)

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 National prescriptions of Sail Canada will apply. These can be found at https://www.sailing.ca/wp-content/uploads/2022/06/sail canada prescriptions 2021 2024 14 03 2022.pdf

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be available at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16180 no later than the start of registration.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board is located at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16180.
- 3.2 [NP] [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on 69, 71, 72 and 73.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SI supplement.
- 3.4 While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The official notice board is located at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16180
- 4.2 The event is open to all boats of the Shark 24 class where either:
 - (a) the person in charge is a full member of the Canadian Shark Class Association (CSCA), or
 - (b) if this is the first CSCA-sanctioned event that the crew is entering in 2023, all crewmembers shall be associate members of CSCA.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by registering online at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16180.

- 4.4 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall:
 - (a) complete the registration form,
 - (b) register all crewmembers, and
 - (c) pay all fees.

5 FEES

- 5.1 The entry fees are as follows:
 - (a) the early entry fee until August 28, 2023 is \$180.00 inclusive of HST plus HST,
 - (b) the standard entry fee is \$200.00 inclusive of HST
 - (c) if every crewmember is under the age of 25 years, CSCA will pay the entry fee provided they have not claimed this incentive at any other regatta in this calendar year. Please notify John Brunt at jbrunt@blaney.com prior to September 5, 2023 to apply for this exemption,

5.2 Other Fees:

(a) Extra dinner tickets for Saturday night are available at a cost of \$27.00 inclusive of HST

6 ADVERTISING

6.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

- 7.5 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first day of racing is 1100.
- 7.6 The scheduled time of the warning signal for subsequent days of racing is 1000.
- 7.7 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1500.

8 EQUPIMENT INSPECTION

- 8.1 Each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement certificate. However, a boat may race without a valid measurement certificate provided:
 - (a) it complies with all other class rules,
 - (b) it has not competed in another CSCA-sanctioned counter regatta in this calendar year,
 - (c) it has not been issued a valid measurement certificate within the past five years, and
 - (d) the person in charge has signed a "statement of understanding" available at: https://shark24.ca/resources/downloads/

This changes RRS 78.1.

8.2 Boats may be inspected at any time.

9 VENUE

- 9.1 Registration is at National Yacht Club, 1 Stadium Road, Toronto, ON
- 9.2 Racing will take place in Humber Bay, approximately 1 nautical mile south and west of the National Yacht Club.

10 COURSES

10.1 The course diagrams (L, LA, W and WA) in RRS S show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

11 SCORING

- 11.1 2 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.2 Series Score:
 - (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 11.3 RRS A5.3 applies.

12 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

12.1 A chartered or loaned boat may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules, provided that the race committee has approved her sail identification before the first race.

13 BERTHING

13.1 [DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while in the harbour.

14 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

14.1 [DP] Boats shall not be hauled out during the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

15 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

15.1 Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around keelboats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the event.

16 RISK STATEMENT

16.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

17 INSURANCE

17.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2 million per incident or the equivalent.

18 CODE OF CONDUCT

18.1 The Ontario Sailing Association CODES OF CONDUCT, available at https://ontariosailing.ca/about/governance/, will apply.

19 PRIZES

- 19.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
 - (a) the Gold Cup Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the regatta, and
 - (b) keeper prizes will be awarded to the captains and crew of the first five boats.
