1 RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of *Sail Canada* to the RRS apply for the entire race; including in US waters, see

www.sailing.ca/files/RRS 2017 2020 Sail Canada Prescription Final EN.pdf

- 1.3 Part 2 of the *RRS* will be replaced with the Right of Way Rules of the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea as amended by Transport Canada between 2000 and 0600 EDT.

- 1.4 World Sailing Special Regulations
- 1.4.1 The LOSHRS Long Distance Race is a Category 3 Event under the *World Sailing* Offshore Special Regulations. The Special Regulations for Category 3 with prescriptions from *Sail Canada* and amended by the Lake Ontario Offshore Racing apply, as documented in:

Lake Ontario Offshore Special Regulations for Category 3 Multihulls

1.4.2 All other LOSHRS races are a Category 4 Event under the *World Sailing* Offshore Special Regulations. The Special Regulations for Category 4 apply with prescriptions from *Sail Canada* and as amended by the Lake Ontario Offshore Racing apply, as documented in:

1.5 Applicable Class Rules

Singlehanded & Doublehanded sailboats racing in

PHRF (Monohull) PHRF- LO Rules shall apply and PHRF-LO is the

Handicap/Measurement Authority.

GLMRA (Multihull) GLMRA Rules shall apply and GLMRA is the

Handicap/Measurement Authority.

- 1. 6 The Lake Ontario Short-Handed Series is governed by *PCYC's Visiting Yachts' Policy*, including pre-registration, available under the link "Additional Event Links" on the Registration and Race Document Web Site.
- 1. 7 The Racing Rule(s) will be changed as outlined below. The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions. The Sailing Instructions may also change other racing rules.
 - 1.7.1 RRS 28.1, RRS 29.1, RRS 64.1 (a) and RRS Appendix A5

Are modified such that a sailboat that is OCS at the start of her class is assessed a thirty-minute penalty. A sailboat starting before her Preparatory

Signal may be protested by the Race Committee, and the Protest Committee will apply an appropriate elapsed time penalty if the boat is found to have infringed this requirement.

1.7.2 RRS 41 Outside Help

"Outside Help" is modified herein to allow all forms of communication. Each sailboat may communicate with any person, competitor, sailboat or outside source of information available using any means available throughout the race.

1.7.3 RRS 42.3 Exceptions

Is modified so an engine may be used for generating electrical power provided that such use does not advance the boat's position.

1. 7.4 RRS 51 Movable Ballast

Is modified to allow canting keels and water ballast, assuming the applicable class/measurement/handicap rules permit them.

1. 7.5 RRS 52 Manual Power

Is modified to allow the use of stored power (electricity) to be used to cant the keel or move water ballast.

All movable ballast systems must be capable of manual operation if the powered systems are inoperable.

Is modified to allow the use of power auto helm devices.

1.7.6 RRS 60.1 (a)

Breaches of specific Sailing Instructions, as denoted in the Sailing Instructions, will not be grounds for a protest by a sailboat.

1.7.7 RRS 62.1 (a)

Is modified to allow the Race Committee the ability to announce sailboats subject to RRS 29.1. The failure to hail or order in which they are called will not be grounds to request redress.

Is modified to allow the Race Committee the ability to announce a sailboat's successful completion at the finish. The failure to hail or order will not be grounds to request redress.

1.7.8 RRS 64.1

Is modified that for infringements of the rules other than Part 2, the Jury may award a lesser penalty than DSQ, unless stated otherwise in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions.

1.7.9 RRS A4 & A5

Is modified such that a sailboat not starting within 30 minutes of her starting signal will be scored DNF.

- 1.8 All sailboats shall comply with Ontario Environmental Protection Act Regulations #343 as documented at
 - www.e-laws.gov.on.ca/html/regs/english/elaws regs 900343 e.htm.
 - Any such disqualification may be used by the Organizing Authority whether to accept future registrations by this sailboat or owner.
- 1.9 The Person in Charge of a participating sailboat shall accurately and fully 'maintain the electronic crew list for the sailboat on the Race Document Web site.

2 ADVERTISING

Sailboats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 The LOSHRS Long Distance Race is restricted to sailboats that meet one of the following stability measurements.

Where m is the Minimum Sailing Weight

For entries, 2 through 4, the sailboat must have a Minimum Sailing Weight of 1500kg as well as the minimum value.

The Organizing Authority, upon application and subsequent review of technical evidence as to the heavy weather stability and crew comfort of a vessel may, at their sole discretion and without appeal, accept or reject such vessel as suitable for this race. It is the responsibility of the owner to obtain and submit the required technical evidence when requested by the Organizing Authority in order to review a sailboat.

- 3.2 Eligible sailboats may be entered in the race by registering online at the Registration and Race Document Web Site.
- 3.3 Supporting documentation for a complete entry includes all information requested in the online entry, at the Registration and Race Document Web Site, as well as the following:
 - 1 Payment of the entry fee(s) online by the race registration deadline in 5.1.
 - 2 Sailboat's valid rating certificate number as soon as available for the year and before her first race by uploading it to Registration and Race Document Web Site.

- 3 For sailboat participating in the Long Distance Race, stability, measurement and value for 3.1, for the specific sailboat or for a sister ship, submitted by email to LOSHRS@LOOR.CA within 48 hours of completion of the online registration.
- 4 Crew information filed and maintained electronically at the Registration and Race Document Web Site. This includes identification of the Person in Charge as per RRS 46 and compliance with the Sail Canada's prescription to RRS 46. The crew information shall accurately represent the crew onboard for the race. The Person in Charge shall update as necessary, for each race.
- 3.4 The race is open to monohull or multihull sailboats, 20 ft. LOA or greater. Divisions will include Flying Sails (FS) and No Flying Sails (NFS) either Single Handed or Double Handed. Divisions may be sub-divided into fleets. These splits will be published at the first competitors's meeting.

The Organizing Authority may assign sailboats to divisions and fleets based on the number of sailboats registered.

Sailboats shall fly the listed numerical pennant, for their division and rating for which they are racing, from their backstay or other prominent position if she has no backstay.

The following table lists the Divisions in the series:

- o Single Handed No Flying Sails
- o Single Handed Flying Sails
- o Double Handed No Flying Sails
- o Double Handed Flying Sails
- o Multihull

The sub-divisions, based on the registration to date, will be published by Monday, May 22, 2017 on the Race Document Web Site. This document lists the starts for each sub-divisions and required back-stay flag, which will be an International Code Signal numeral pennent, from one (1) to nine (9).

3.5 Required Handicap Certificates

Singlehanded & Doublehanded sailboats racing in

PHRF Must have a valid PHRF- LO Certificate, see NOR

GLMRA Must have a valid GLMRA Certificate, see NOR 17

For sailboats racing under PHRF from outside the PHRF-LO area, arrangements shall be made in advance to obtain a PHRF-LO certificate. Contact PHRF-LO, www.phrf-lo.org, directly, well in advance of the event, to obtain details on accomplishing this.

- 3.6 The Person in Charge, under RRS 46, shall be 18 years of age or older.
- 3.7 Competitors' sailboats shall only display a sail number registered specific to the sailboat at the time of its commission. Requests, on the *Alternate Sail Number Form*, available on the Registration and Race Document Web Site, to display

alternative sail numbers to the sailboat's commissioned sail number may be approved by the Organizing Authority and must be filed with the Race Committee, at either the Competitor's Meeting or by email to the RACECOMMITTEE@LOOR.CA prior to race involving the Alternative Sail Number.

4 FEES

4.1 Required fees are as follows:

All Classes

Full Season

Until Mar. 15^{th} \$125.00 CAD + \$16.25 CAD HST = \$141.25 CAD On & after Mar. 16^{th} \$175.00 CAD + \$22.75 CAD HST = \$197.75 CAD

Single Race (Each day of YYC/DYC weekends are a single race)

\$55.00 CAD + \$7.15 CAD HST = \$62.15 CAD

HST will be charged when applicable.

4.2 Refund - OA will allow a 50% refund upon written request up until the registration deadline, in SI 5.1. Written requests must be sent by mail to LOOR c/o PCYC or emailed to LOSHRS@LOOR.CA. The retained amount covers incurred expense. No refunds will be allowed after the registration deadline. No series refunds will be made after the deadline for the first race.

6 MEASUREMENTS AND INSPECTIONS

A sailboat may be inspected at any time during the period from the Participants' Meeting until three hours after her finish. The Race Committee may, at the finish of the race, direct a sailboat to proceed directly to a designated location at the destination yacht club. A boat which fails to follow such directions or which subsequently fails the inspection may be protested by the Race Committee.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available at the Registration and Race Document Web Site by May 23, 2017. Sailing Instructions will only be available on the Registration and Race Document Web Site.

11 BERTHING

Sailboats berthing at PCYC before or after the race shall follow *PCYC's Visiting Yachts' Policy*, including pre-registration, for each race available under "Additional Event Links" (click on this) on the Registration and Race Document Web Site. This needs to be done for each race.

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Each sailboat may communicate with any person, competitor, sailboat, or outside source of information available using any means available throughout the race.

13 PRIZES

Flags shall be awarded as follows:

Individual Races

Flags are awarded for first, second and third in each fleet.

If there are 11 or more starters in a fleet for a given race, the fleet may be sub divided into sub fleets for awarding 1, 2 and 3 place flags to the sub fleets in that race. The score, position in its fleet, for a sailboat in a race will be used in calculating the overall Fleet Series score for that sailboat.

Fleet Series

A white flag will be awarded for first place in each fleet for the series scoring as defined in Section 10 Scoring.

Trophies

A list of the trophies awarded, their eligibility requirements and selection methodology is available at www.loor.ca/loshrs/awards.

Awards Night shall be announced at a later time.

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any

competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

15 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance policy with a minimum coverage of \$2,000,000 CAD per event for Canadian sailboats and an adequate level of third-party liability insurance applicable in Canadian and US waters for non-Canadian sailboats.

Please ensure eligibility under the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), as stated from the RRS, below:

"46 PERSON IN CHARGE

A boat shall have on board a person in charge designated by the member or organization that entered the boat. See rule 75.

SAIL CANADA prescribes that the designated person in charge, if resident in Canada, shall be a member of a club affiliated with SAIL CANADA.

75 ENTERING A RACE

- 75.1 To enter a race, a boat shall comply with the requirements of the organizing authority of the race. She shall be entered by
- (a) a member of a club or other organization affiliated to a World Sailing member national authority,
- (b) such a club or organization, or
- (c) a member of a World Sailing member national authority.
- 75.2 Competitors shall comply with *World Sailing* Regulation 19, Eligibility Code."

For a Person in Charge, who is an Ontario resident, but is not a member of a *Sail Canada* yacht club, can contact *Ontario Sailing*, www.ontariosailing.ca, to purchase a 'Maple Leaf Fund Right to Race Card'.
