### **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

### 1. Rules

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

### 2. Entries

Competitors may enter by delivering a completed entry form and registration fee to http://bit.ly/Melges14LakeGenevaChallenge.

# 3. Notices to Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located inside the Lake Geneva Yacht Club.

# 4. Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the Signal Boat. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag AP is lowered.

# 5. Schedule and Class Flags

A competitors' meeting will be held at 0915, 6/10/17, at the Lake Geneva Yacht Club. The warning signal for the first race will be 1000. Subsequent races will be held as soon as practicable after the end of the previous race. The class flag is a white flag with a black M-14.

## 6. Racing Area

The racing area will be the navigable waters of Lake Geneva.

### 7. Courses and Marks

The courses will be Windward Leeward and if conditions permit Triangles. The course will be designated on a white board located on the RC boat. All marks will be orange inflatable cylinders.

## 8. Starting and Finishing Lines

The starting and finishing lines will be between an orange staff flag and an orange inflatable ball. Races will be started using RRS 26.

### 9. Time Limit

The time limit for each race will be 90 min for the first boat to finish.

### 10. Protests

Protests shall be delivered to the PRO within 20 minutes after the race committee finish boat docks. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as practicable after racing each day.

## 11. Scoring

10 races are scheduled. All scores will count. One race constitutes a series.
