NOTICE OF RACE

1 - RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020*.
- 1.2 The CSA Classic Rating Rule will apply for all boats except Spirit of Tradition.
- 1.3 For Spirit of Tradition boats, the CSA Rating Rule will apply.
- 1.4 Antigua Classic Yacht Regatta (ACYR) Minimum Safety Rules will apply.
- 1.5 The sailing instructions may change some racing rules. Changes to the racing rules will appear in full in the sailing instructions.

2 - ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3 - ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 All boats should have a full keel, be of heavy to moderate displacement, built of wood or steel and be of traditional rig and appearance.
- 3.2 Old craft using modern materials, such as epoxy or glass sheathing, or new craft built along the lines of an old design are acceptable.
- 3.3 Fibre glass boats should have a full long keel with a keel-hung rudder, and be a descendant of a wooden boat design.
- 3.4 Boats built of other materials may be accepted if they have a gaff or traditional schooner rig.
- 3.5 Boats not fitting into the above categories may apply in writing, with documents and photographs or drawings to support their request for entry.
- 3.6 Any boats unknown to the Regatta shall complete a Pre Entry Form (available on the website www. antiguaclassics.com) and submit it along with photographs of hull and rig for approval.

- 3.7 Previous entrants should email entry@antiguaclassics.com and they will be sent the codes to update their online entry.
- 3.8 Information is available on the website and from the Antigua Yacht Club.
- 3.9 To be eligible for the Concours d'Elégance and the Single-Handed Race a boat must be a participant in the Regatta.

4 - CLASSIFICATION

- 4.1 The following are classes, which may be used: Vintage, Classic, Traditional, Classic GRP, Spirit of Tradition or Tall Ships.
- 4.2 Boats will be put in a class according to year of build and type.
- 4.3 Each class will be divided into groups of similar size, rig and performance as much as possible.

5 - FEES

- 5.1 US\$6.00 per foot LOD (length on deck) for boats 50 foot and below, US\$8.00 for boats 51 foot to 99 foot and US\$10.00 for boats 100 foot and above - if registered by 1st March 2018.
- 5.2 After 1st March 2018 entry fees rise to US\$10.00 per foot LOD for boats 50 foot and below, US\$12.00 for boats 51 foot to 99 foot and US\$14.00 for boats 100 foot and above.
- 5.3 Entries will NOT be considered after 16th April 2018 unless authorized by the Committee. Please enter early.

6 - SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Registration and Inspection: Wednesday 18th April at the Antigua Yacht Club from 0800 to 1800 hrs.
- 6.2 All Captains must register to confirm arrival and to receive current regatta documents.
- 6.3 Late registrations may not receive free promotional materials.
- 6.4 Racing: Thursday 19th April Single Handed Race and Skippers' Briefing

Friday 20th April – RACE 1 Saturday 21st April – RACE 2 Sunday 22nd April - RACE 3

Monday 23rd April - RACE 4 and Prize Giving

Tuesday 24th April - Gig Racing

6.5 Social events include a Welcome Party, Concours d'Elégance and Single-Handed Race Prize Givings, Parade of Classics, Cream Teas, Prize Giving, Music Night and more.

7 - MEASUREMENT AND RATINGS

- 7.1 All measurements must be given on the Entry Form and attached sail declaration.
- 7.2 A Classics Simplified CSA rating will be issued for each yacht. ACYR reserves the right to question and verify information submitted on Entry Forms.
- 7.3 Any measurement fee incurred for verification will be charged directly to the yacht by the CSA measurer
- 7.4 Spirit of Tradition yachts must obtain a current CSA measurement certificate from a CSA measurer and submit it with their Entry Form.

8 - SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 Sailing instructions will be issued at Registration.

9 - VENUE

9.1 Racing will take place off the south coast of Antigua.
On shore events will take place at the Antigua
Yacht Club and in the English Harbour area.

10 - SAFE RACING

- 10.1 The primary focus of ACYR racing is prudent seamanship and sailing in the safest possible manner in all situations.
- 10.2 If ACYR receives corroborative or substantiated reports of a yacht being handled in an overly aggressive, un-seamanlike or unsafe manner, they may excuse the yacht from the regatta.
- 10.3 For further guidance, especially for smaller vessels, consult the section in the annual programme, Safety on the Race Course.

11 - COURSES

- 11.1 Examples of courses can be seen on the website and in the Regatta Programme.
- 11.2 Course cards will be handed out at registration.

- 11.3 Each course will be approximately 20 to 24 miles.
- 11.4 Starts and finishes will be immediately outside Falmouth Harbour, Antigua.

12 - SCORING

- 12.1 All races completed will count.
- 12.2 One race is required to complete a series.

13 - DOCKAGE

- 13.1 There are several marinas in Falmouth Harbour and English Harbour.
- 13.2 Limited free dockage is available at the Antigua Yacht Club Marina and Nelson's Dockyard. For further information on dockage contact the dockmasters.

14 - PRIZES

14.1 A list of prizes and/or trophies to be awarded will be given in the Sailing Instructions.

15 - DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

15.1 Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. AYCR, AYC and/or the Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the Regatta.
