

# 125<sup>th</sup> I-LYA SAIL REGATTA

August 3 - August 5, 2018

Organizing Authority: Inter-Lake Yachting Association

Host: Put-in-Bay Yacht Club, Put-in-Bay, Ohio

## NOTICE OF RACE

### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the current rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. RRS 60.1(a) is changed to prohibit a boat from protesting another boat for an alleged breach of a class rule requiring class membership.
- 1.3. The first sentence of RRS A2 is changed to read "Each boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores."
- 1.4. US Sailing Prescriptions to Rule 63.2 will not apply.

### 2. ELIGIBILITY, ENTRY, AND PLACEMENT

- 2.1. This event is open to members of US SAILING or other National Authorities, members of recognized yacht clubs, members of recognized class associations, and others as may be designated by the Organizing Authority.
- 2.2. Expected classes: PHRF, JAM, Off Shore Multihull, Cruising Class, T-10, Interlake, Hobie Wave and Beach Cats. Other classes may be added including a separate one design keelboat course if sufficient entries apply.
- 2.3. The Organizing Authority shall, at its sole discretion, determine eligibility and placement within divisions.
- 2.4. Boats that sail in club or other races, except those promoting charities, are not eligible to participate in Cruising Class. Such boats are encouraged to register in JAM class if they wish to sail "Around the Islands"
- 2.5. Eligible boats shall register using online registration by the specified deadlines. Boats registering on line may email their valid rating-measurement certificate to the registrar. **Should you need to mail anything to the registrar please contact him to get specific instructions.**

- 2.6. Online registration is available at [www.i-lya.org](http://www.i-lya.org) and [yachtscoring.com](http://yachtscoring.com)
- 2.7. **Deadline** for receipt of registrations is 2359 hours, Friday, July 20<sup>th</sup> 2018 for all Keelboats, Offshore Multihulls, JAM, and Cruising Classes, and 2359 hours, Friday, July 27<sup>th</sup> 2018 for Centerboards & Beachcat Classes.
- 2.8. The acceptance of registrations received after the specified deadlines in 2.7 are at the discretion of the Organizing Authority and, if accepted, are subject to an additional late fee of \$35.00 and may not include dockage.
- 2.9. Only those boats whose registration and fees have been paid in full before the registration deadline as stated in 2.7, or accepted by the Organizing Authority, will be included in the class and divisional splits.
- 2.10. All boats shall deliver completed and signed "Waiver of Liability" form either via Yacht Scoring with registration or to the regatta office at the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club no later than 2000 hours on Thursday, August 2nd 2018.
- 2.11. A minimum of five (5) boats registered before the above deadline in 2.8 shall be required to be considered a One Design Class.

### 3. FEES

3.1. Entry fees received before on or **before July 5<sup>th</sup> 2108** are as follows:

3.4. It is imperative that the true total length is furnished to the registrar for docking purposes.

Improper lengths being given may result in you being docked at the dock masters discretion.

Bow sprints, pulpits, motors protruding beyond the hull should be counted as part of overall length.

These overall lengths are for dockage purposes only and shall have no effect on Ratings.

### 4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

4.1. Multiple back-to-back races are scheduled each day. No race may be started after 12 noon on Sunday.

4.2. The time of the first warning signal for each course will be as follows on the following dates:

## 5. MEASUREMENT

- 5.1. Each boat shall conform to its class rules.
- 5.2. Casual Cruising division competitors will not be required to submit a measurement certificate. Boats without a current certificate will be assigned a temporary rating at the discretion of the Organizing Authority which shall be valid for this regatta only and cannot be appealed. **This exception does not apply to the JAM Class.**
- 5.3. Boats registering online shall either mail to the Registrar no later than the registration deadline or deliver to the Regatta Office at the Put-in Bay Yacht Club no later than **2000 hours on Thursday August 2, 2018**, a copy of their current valid PHRF Certificate or Current one design measurement/rating certificate.
- 5.4. In the event of a conflict between PHRF rating authorities, a temporary rating will be assigned at the discretion of the Organizing Authority, I-LYA, through the I-LYA Sail Regatta Race Committee, which shall be valid for this regatta only and cannot be appealed.
- 5.5. A boat and/or its equipment may be inspected, or directed to a place for inspection, at any time for compliance with Class Rules, the Sailing Instructions, and this Notice of Race.

## 6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1. Race packets, including Sailing Instructions will be available on Thursday, August 2 from 1600-2000 hours at the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club. Sailing Instructions for each division MAY be posted on Yachtscoring prior to regatta.
- 6.2. Daily skippers meetings will be conducted by each course's PRO. Sailing Instructions to dictate time and location.

## 7. VENUE

- 7.1. All racing will take place on the Near Shore waters of western Lake Erie and its islands.

## 8. COURSES

- 8.1. PHRF, One-Design Keelboat Division, and Offshore Multihull Division will primarily sail Around the Islands courses and possibly windward/leeward courses as time and weather conditions allow.
- 8.2. Centerboard and Beachcat Division will sail a combination of Windward-Leeward and Triangle courses.
- 8.3. JAM & Casual Cruising Classes will race in the same division and sail Around the Islands courses.

## 9. SCORING

- 9.1. The Low-Point System of Appendix A will be used.
  - 9.1.1. A boat's series score shall be the total of all her race scores. That is, no races are excluded. This changes Rule A2. One race will constitute a series. This may be amended for the Centerboard and Beachcat classes by the sailing instructions for that course.
- 9.2. JAM & PHRF I-LYA Championship will be given to the JAM & PHRF boat with the best average score in her division calculated by the Cox-Sprague formula. The average score is calculated by adding the individual Cox-Sprague scores for each race and dividing the total by the number of races scored. Ties are broken according to RRS A.8.

## 10. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 10.1. Unrestricted for One-Design Centerboards & Beachcats, others only by permission I-LYA Sail Race Committee.

## 11. AWARDS

- 11.1. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place series finishes in each class.
- 11.2. Daily prizes will be awarded following the conclusion of each day's racing for the first race of that day.
- 11.3. 1<sup>st</sup> place award for Junior entry in PHRF. Vessel must be sailed by all Junior sailors per I-LYA Junior Bayweek eligibility rules. Juniors eligible who have graduated in 2018 or later. Vessel may have 1 adult observer for insurance purposes who may not participate in the sailing of the vessel. Scoring according to 9.2.
- 11.4. 1<sup>st</sup> place Female vessel in PHRF Class. Crew must consist of all Female Sailors. Scoring according to 9.2.

## 12. DOCKAGE

- 12.1. Dockage for all Keelboats and Offshore Multihulls and Dry Dockage for Centerboards and Beachcats is included in the registration fees and will be available only to those who have registered and paid in full for the regatta by the deadline specified herein. Registration for keel boats after JULY 20<sup>th</sup> MAY NOT include dockage(sec 2.8)
- 12.2. Competitors shall follow the directions of the I-LYA Dock Master each day. ( See sec 3.3) The I-LYA Dock Master and his/her crew, including the person in charge of the drysail area at PIBYC, are part of the Race Committee.
- 12.3. Keelboats and Offshore Multihulls may at their discretion opt out of the provided regatta dockage for a registration credit of \$100.00 All boats desiring to opt out of dockage must request accordingly at the time of regatta registration and pay the appropriate registration fee. Boats opting out of dockage will not be provided a dockage assignment on the I-LYA dock spaces.
- 12.4. **This being the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this glorious regatta, the ILYA strongly encourages each entrant to "DRESS SHIP" while docked or ashore and proudly display your flags!**

## 13. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid, third-party insurance sufficient to cover liability for loss, damage, personal injury, or death.

## 14. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
