Notice of Race

1. Organising Authority

1.1 Organised by the Cowes Corinthian Yacht Club in association with the Cowes International Etchells Fleet.

2. Rules

- 2.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 2020.
- 2.2 The Etchells Class Rules will apply.
- 2.3 No boat, rig, sail measurements, sail cards or crew weights will officially be taken.
- 2.4 Sails may be borrowed in accordance with Etchells Class Rule C.10.3(i).
- 2.5 Training sails may be used but shall have your boat's correct sail number displayed. This changes Etchells class rules.
- 2.6 In accordance within Regulation 20.4.1 of the World Sailing Advertising Code, the OA may require certain boats to display advertising.
- 2.7 Coaching advise may be given on-the-water during races by the coaches provided by the class. This changes RRS 41

 Outside Help.

3. Advertising

3.1 Advertising is permitted in accordance with Class Rules and World Sailing Regulation 20. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and/or supplied by the Organising Authority.

4. Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The event is open to boats of the International Etchells Class whose owner and crews are current members of the Class Association.
- 4.2 Entry is via Yacht Scoring.

5. Fees

5.1 The entry fee for the event is £240.00 per boat.

6. Venue

- 6.1 The Regatta Office will be at Cowes Corinthian Yacht Club.
- 6.2 Boats may be berthed at Shepards Wharf Marina.

- **7.1 On Saturday:** Practice starts will be at 1200 and 1205. Main race Warning Signal at 1210. *No X-Ray or First Sub Flags on practice starts, Just OCS radio calls.* **This practice procedure will be applicable to all races that day.**
- 7.2 On Sunday and Monday: Practice starts will be at 1100 and 1105. Main race Warning Signal at 1110. No X-Ray or First Sub Flags on practice starts, Just OCS radio calls. This practice procedure will be applicable to all races that day.
- 7.3 The event will consist of nine races.
- 7.4 The intention is that there will be no more than 3 races a day, but there could be more. Additional races may be sailed either in advance or arrears in order to complete the programme because of weather or other reason.
- 7.5 On the last day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1430.

8. Sailing Instructions

8.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at the Briefing and may be posted on the Cowes Corinthian Yacht Club and Yacht Scoring websites prior to the event.

9. Courses

- 9.1 Racing will be in the Solent from a Committee Boat.
- 9.2 Courses using laid or fixed or navigation marks will be broadcast on VHF and displayed on the signal boat. The format will be predominantly windward/leeward.
- 9.3 A list of marks to be used will be issued with the Sailing Instructions.

10. Penalties

10.1 The penalty for breaking a rule of RRS Part 2 shall be a One Turn Penalty (one tack and one gybe in the same direction) except that for infringements occurring within the Zone when the penalty shall be a Two Turns. Penalty (two tacks and two gybes in the same direction).

11. Scoring

- 11.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.
- 11.2 One race shall be completed to constitute a series. This changes RRS A2.
- 11.3 When four or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 11.4 When from five to seven races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 11.5 When eight or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race score excluding her two worst scores.

12. Haul-Out Restrictions

12.1 Keelboats shall be afloat by 1730 the day before the first race and not be hauled out during the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the Race Committee.

13. Radio Communication

- 13.1 All boats shall carry a working marine band VHF receiver with channels 16, 67, 72, 77, 80, MI (37a).
- 13.2 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction applies to all communication devices except to any tracker which might be supplied.

14. Prizes

- 14.1 The event main prizegiving will be held at Cowes Yacht Haven as soon as possible after the final day's racing and any subsequent protests on Monday 7th May.
- 14.2 The Corinthian Prize will be awarded to the highest placed boat sailed under World Sailing Classification Group 1. Only those crews competing for the Corinthian prize must provide their World Sailing, sailor classification number before racing starts.

15. Risk Statement

YOU MUST TICK AGREEMENT TO THIS ON THE YACHT SCORING WEB SITE ENTRY

Liability Waiver Declaration by Owner/ Skipper

I understand that Yacht Racing can be dangerous and accept my responsibilities as set out in the Risk Statement in the Notice of Race. Before racing I will effect adequate and suitable insurance and ensure that my crew is aware of:

- The undertaking of this Declaration
- The importance of effecting appropriate personal insurance
- Their responsibility in rules observance, and in particular RRS 1.2 (wearing personal floatation devices adequate for the conditions).

I agree to be bound by RRS, RYA Prescriptions, the Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions and other applicable rules. The boat and sails will be available for inspection. If any alteration likely to affect the boat is made, e.g. to sails, rig, mast ballast or trim, I will notify the Race Committee immediately. I will ensure that no crew member races contrary to the terms of any ban imposed by World Sailing, a National Authority or the OA.

In participating in the event any competitor automatically grants to the Organising Authority permission to make, use and show, from time to time, any motion pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the event without compensation, in perpetuity.

I understand and agree that the information given in this race entry and also the Race entry lists and results will be maintained on the Class's or OA's computer to be used for all aspects of race organization including publicity.

16. Insurance

16.1 Each participating boat is required to hold insurance cover and in particular to hold adequate insurance against third party claims of at least £2 million.

17. Support Boats

17.1 Any interference by a support boat with the racing or event organisation other than those provided by the class may result in a penalty applied at the discretion of the protest committee to the associated team.

18. Chartered or Loaned Boats

18.1 RRS G3 applies.
