Schedule	There are two races scheduled > Saturday July 14 > Saturday August 25			
Eligibility	Boats owned or chartered by members of IHYC, RYC, OGYC or BHC are eligible to race. All boats are requested to register for the series by going to indianharboryc.com and clicking on the "Regatta" button. That will guide you to online registration. There is no fee. Also, indicate if you wish to race with a spinnaker. If enough boats want to race with spinnakers a separate division will be created. If you do not have a PHRF handicap the race committee will assign one.			
Sails	Except in a possible spinnaker division, no spinnakers, gennikers or bloopers are permitted. No more than one sail at a time in the fore triangle except during a seaman-like sail change. Whisker poles and spinnaker poles can be used in accordance with Rule 50 which requires poles to be attached to the foremast.			
Communication	The committee will monitor and communicate on VHF channel 72.			
Start	Boats shall pass from north to south between a yellow flag on the Race Committee Signal Boat and mark X located west of Red Rock and south of the Indian Harbor mooring field. The starting sequence will be Division III, followed by Division II and Division I. If there is a spinnaker division it will be Division IV and will start after Division I.

Signals	Individual Recall General Recall Postponement Cancellation: Abandonment:	Code flag 'X' (white with blue cross) with one horn signal and radio hail on VHF channel 72. Code flag 'First Substitute' (yellow and blue triangle) with two Horn signals and verbal hail. Code flag 'AP' (red and white stripes) with two horn signals. Code flag 'N' (blue and white checks) with three horn signals. Code flag 'N' (blue and white checks) with three horn signals.		
Course	Boats shall, in order, either pass north of Nun 4 Cormorant Reef, west of Nun 2 Great Captain Island, and east of Green Gong 1, or east of Green Gong 1, west of Nun 2 Great Captain Island, and north of Nun 4 Cormorant Reef. The choice of course direction <u>IS AT</u> <u>THE DISCRETION OF EACH BOAT.</u> Note that no course shortening is possible. Any boat that chooses to abandon the race is requested to contact the Race Committee on channel 68.			
Finish	Boats shall pass from south to north between a yellow flag on the race committee signal boat and Mark X located to the west of Red Rock and south of the Indian Harbor mooring area.			
Time Limit	1900 hours for all divisions			
Scoring	YRA of LIS PHRF non-spinnaker ratings will be used, except for a possible spinnaker division that will use the appropriate rating. Corrected times are calculated by time-on-time allowances. All divisions will be scored separately regardless of starting sequence.			
	Each race shall be scor	ed separately. The two days' races will not be scored as a series.		
Protests	The exoneration penalty available under RRS 44 for a boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 (RRS 10 through 22) shall be a <u>One-Turn Penalty</u> consisting of a tack and a jibe taken at the time of the incident. Boats shall report any protest, and also any penalty turns taken, to the Race Committee when they finish. Protests shall be written on forms available at each club, and submitted to the Front Desk of the sponsoring club within one hour of the Race Committee Boat having docked. All protests will initially be arbitrated within the next hour (or as soon as possible). The Protest Arbitration Penalty shall be the 20% Scoring Penalty as described in RRS 44.3(c). When a protest is not resolved by arbitration, a hearing will immediately follow, unless re-scheduled to a later date for the mutual convenience of the participants.			
Safety	It is the responsibility of skippers and crew to wear US Coast Guard approved life jackets whenever conditions warrant. Furthermore, as a condition of participation in any race, the owner and crew agree that the safety of the boat and her crew and the decision whether or not to start or continue a race is solely their responsibility.			
Prizes	Prizes 1 <sup>st</sup> through 3 <sup>rd</sup> will be awarded in each division.
