# **NOTICE OF RACE Incorporating Amendment #1**

The Organizing Authority (OA) is the New York Yacht Club Regatta Association, Inc. The host is New York Yacht Club (NYYC).

# GENERAL FORMAT

The 159<sup>th</sup> NYYC Annual Regatta presented by Rolex will consist of the following segments:

- The Around–the–Island Race (scored separately) on Friday, June 14, open to all eligible yachts with no entry fee;
- ▶ BLUE and WHITE Fleets The traditional Two-Day Series on Saturday and Sunday, June 15-16, for yachts racing in IRC and One-Design classes;
- GREEN Fleet The traditional Two-Day Series on Saturday and Sunday, June 15-16, for yachts racing in Classics, 12 Metres, 6 Metres, and the "Navigator" Races for PHRF and Double-handed classes. Racing will be held on Narragansett Bay using South Bay Race Chart courses with one or two races each day. The Navigator classes will have one race each day and each day will be a separate race with prizes.
- ➤ RED Fleet Two-Day Series on Saturday and Sunday, June 15-16, for smaller One-Design classes. Racing will be held on Narragansett Bay.
- The Farr 40 USA Circuit Event #4 will run from June 13-16 and will include racing on Thursday-Friday, June 13-14 organized by the Farr 40 Class, and racing on Saturday-Sunday, June 15-16 as part of the 159<sup>th</sup> NYYC Annual Regatta presented by Rolex.

Teams can enter to compete for two team trophies:

- Rolex Cup Two-yacht teams in the Around–the–Island Race on Friday, June 14.
- ➤ Great Corinthian Trophy Yacht club teams (other than NYYC) of three or more yachts competing in the Blue or White Fleets in the Two-Day Series.

The Annual Regatta is part of the 2013 Gulf Stream Series (<a href="www.us-irc.org">www.us-irc.org</a>) and is the first event in the NYYC Classic Yacht Series.

# 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) including the 2013 IRC Rules Parts A, B and C, the 2013 HPR Rules v.4, and the PHRF Regulations as administered by the PHRF of NB. Appendix D, Team Racing Rules, will not apply for the Rolex Cup or the Great Corinthian Trophy team events.
- 1.2 The following documents shall apply and are posted as addenda on the Annual Regatta website:
  - a) Addendum 1 Offshore Special Regulations
    - All yachts shall minimally comply with the 2012-2013 ISAF Offshore Special Regulations, Category 5 (OSR) and shall comply with their class rules, where applicable.
    - Yachts that are not normally rigged with lifelines are exempt from Regulation 3.14.
    - In the event of a conflict between these regulations and applicable class rules, the class rules shall apply.
  - b) Addendum 2 US SAILING Prescriptions to the RRS. Only the prescriptions listed in this Addendum shall apply.
  - c) Addendum 3 NYYC Classics Rules shall apply to all yachts racing in the Classics division.

- d) Addendum 4 Farr 40 USA Circuit Event #4 applies to the Farr 40 class and replaces this Notice of Race.
- 1.3 The sailing instructions may describe rules or changes to class rules that will apply to specific classes.
- 1.4 The protest committee may impose suitable penalties, other than disqualification, for violations of the ISAF Offshore Special Regulations or non-Part 2 rules. This changes RRS 64.1.

# 2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 A yacht and her crew shall comply with ISAF Regulation 20, Advertising Code.
- 2.2 Each yacht shall display the Rolex backstay flag and bow stickers provided at registration while racing. Classics, S Class, 6 Metres and 12 Metres will not be required to apply the bow stickers.

#### 3 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 Entry is open to yachts with a minimum LOA of 25 feet that satisfy one or more of the entry requirements in NOR 3.2 to 3.9. The OA reserves the right to limit the number of entries in any class. In addition, the OA may reject the entry of any yacht that may not fit the general parameters of the other yachts entered with regard to size and/or design.
- 3.2 **IRC Yachts**: Entry is open to all yachts with a valid 2013 IRC certificate.
  - IRC Rules 22.4.1 and 22.4.2 are changed to read:
  - a) The crew weight shall not exceed 85kg multiplied by the Crew Number printed on the certificate; OR
  - b) The number of crew shall not exceed the crew number on the boat's IRC certificate with no weight limit.
  - c) One additional crew under the age of 16 is permitted and shall not count against the crew or weight limit.
  - d) Yachts electing the first option (crew weight) may weigh in during registration times shown in NOR 6.2. Scales will be available to any competitors to check their weight. Weighing in is not required; however, a yacht whose crew does not weigh in completely, and is later protested under this rule, shall make all crew available to be weighed in prior to the protest hearing in order to be scored.
- 3.3 **HPR:** Yachts entered in IRC that also submit a valid HPR certificate in accordance with NOR 8.1, will be dual-scored for HPR. Scoring will be time-on-time using the TCF's listed on the certificate. The HPR crew weight limit may be declared, but must conform to that listed on the HPR certificate.
- 3.4 **One-Design Yachts**: Entries are open to all classes with a minimum of eight entries or as approved by the OA. Eligible one-design classes must meet the LOA minimum of 25 feet or be invited by the OA and may include: Swan 42, 6 Metre, Beneteau First 36.7, Herreshoff 'S' Class, Etchells, J/70, J/80, J/105, J/109, Farr 30, Melges 32, J/111, J/120, J/44, J/122 and others as may be determined. Entrants must meet all ownership, class membership (including crew eligibility requirements), sail measurement and crew weigh-in requirements as required by their respective classes.
- 3.5 **Classic Yachts**: Entries are open to all Vintage and Classic yachts that meet the design, construction and equipment parameters described in NOR Addendum A NYYC CRF Classic Class Rules. All yachts must hold a valid CRF rating. A link to an application for a CRF rating can be found on the regatta website.
- 3.6 **12 Metre Yachts**: Entries are open to any 12 Metre yacht holding a valid Certificate of Measurement that is current with the 12 Metre Class annual dues and any certificate filing fees must have been paid. 12 Metres will race as a single class. The OA will use handicap ratings if provided by the ITMA.
- 3.7 **NAVIGATORS RACES:** Entry into the Navigators races on Saturday, June 15, and Sunday, June 16, will be open to the all yachts with a valid 2013 PHRF of Narragansett Bay certificate rating of 165 or less. Yachts with a rating of 166 or higher will be permitted to enter at the discretion of the OA.
  - a) There is no crew number or weight limitation, except as noted in NOR 3.8.
  - b) Yachts from other PHRF areas must obtain a PHRF certificate from PHRF-NB at http://www.phrf-nb.org/.
  - c) A **Double-handed class** will be offered if there is sufficient interest.
  - d) A non-spinnaker class may be offered if there is sufficient interest.
- 3.8 Except in the Double-handed Class, the minimum crew aboard while racing shall be four except as specified in Class Rules.
- 3.9 Each yacht shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating with the Race Committee on fleet channels.

#### 4 ENTRY

- 4.1 **Entry Forms:** The entry form is available on the Annual Regatta website. Yachts also entering the Around-the-Island Race on Friday, June 14, must check the appropriate box on the entry form. The official entry form and entry fee shall be submitted online on or before 1700 on Monday, June 10, 2013.
- 4.2 **Registration:** All yachts shall pick up their regatta bags during the registration times listed in NOR 6.2. Registration will take place in the NYYC Sailing Center, Harbour Court, 5 Halidon Avenue, Newport, RI 02840.
- 4.3 **Rolex Cup Team Entries:** The Rolex Cup will be presented to the best two-yacht team in the Around-the-Island Race on Friday, June 14. Entries may be made online on the Annual Regatta website or at registration and submitted on or before 1800 on Thursday, June 13, 2013.
- 4.4 **Great Corinthian Trophy Team Entries:** The Great Corinthian Trophy will be presented to the yacht club team, other than New York Yacht Club, represented by three or more yachts competing in the Blue or White Fleets with the best score in the Annual Regatta Two-Day Series. All helmspersons shall be Group 1 as defined in ISAF Regulation 22, ISAF Sailor Classification Code. Entries may be made online on the Annual Regatta website or at registration and submitted on or before 1800 on Friday, June 14, 2013.
- 4.5 **Liability Waivers:** Crew liability waivers will be available on the Annual Regatta website and submitted before racing.

# 5 FEES

- 5.1 **Around-the-Island Race:** There is no entry fee for the Around-the-Island Race on Friday, June 14.
- 5.2 **Entry fees:** An entry fee for racing on Saturday and Sunday shall be paid with the online entry form. To determine the applicable Entry Fee, a yacht's LOA is to be rounded downward to the nearest whole number. (e.g. 49.65' = 49')

**Adjustments to entry fees:** Yachts entered in the 2013 Annapolis to Newport Race may deduct \$50 from their entry fee.

- 5.3 **Team entry:** There is no additional fee for a team to enter either the Rolex Cup or the Great Corinthian Trophy.
- 5.4 Late Entry fee: A late fee of \$100 will be charged entries received after 1700 on Monday, June 10.
- 5.5 **Late Rating Certificate fee:** A late certificate fee of \$100 will be charged for rating certificates filed after 1700 on Monday, June 10, as required in NOR 8.1.
- 5.6 **Dinner Tickets:** Dinner Tickets are not included in the entry fee. Tickets to the Annual Regatta Dinner will be available for purchase on the online entry form through Monday, June 10. Depending on availability, additional tickets can be purchased through the NYYC Special Events office or at registration.

### 6 SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

6.1 A representative from each yacht shall appear at registration to obtain class assignments and scratch sheets, bow stickers and backstay flags, and to turn in the Crew Waiver Form. All shore events will take place at Harbour Court.

6.3 No Warning Signal shall be made after 1500 on Sunday, June 16.

# 7 CREW WEIGH-INS

- 7.1 Crew weigh-ins will be conducted only if required by applicable class rules.
- 7.2 The official scale will be available in the Sailing Center at times posted on the Official Notice Board for yachts wishing to confirm their compliance with applicable crew weight limitations.

# **8 MEASUREMENT**

- 8.1 Each yacht shall submit a valid certificate to the NYYC Sailing Office before 1700 on Monday, June 10.
  - (a) 12 Metres shall submit a copy of the cover page of their valid Certificate of Measurement signed by the ITMA Technical Director.
  - (b) One-design yachts shall submit a copy of their valid class measurement certificate when one is required by their class rules.
  - (c) PHRF yachts shall submit a copy of their valid 2013 PHRF-NB certificate.
  - (d) IRC yachts shall submit a copy of their valid 2013 IRC certificate.
  - (e) HPR yachts shall submit a copy of their valid 2013 HPR certificate in addition to a valid IRC certificate.
  - (f) Classic Yachts shall have a valid CRF certificate on file.
- 8.2 Yachts, including all qualifying equipment and sails, may be subject to random inspection by the OA at any time during this event.

# 9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND CLASS ASSIGNMENTS

Sailing instructions and scratch sheets for the 159<sup>th</sup> NYYC Annual Regatta presented by Rolex will be available on the Annual Regatta website and at registration.

#### 10 VENUE

Races will be held off Newport, RI, on Rhode Island Sound or in Narragansett Bay.

#### 11 COURSES

- 11.1 Courses for all classes will be defined in the sailing instructions.
- 11.2 South Bay Race Chart marks may be used for races held in Narragansett Bay and will be described in the sailing instructions.

# 12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1 If class rules specify a penalty, a yacht that may have broken a rule of Part 2 while racing may take a penalty at the time of the incident as provided in her class rules.
- 12.2 If the class rules do not specify a penalty, rule 44.1 is changed so that a yacht has the choice between penalty systems and the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty. A yacht may choose either to:
  - (a) take a One-Turn Penalty in accordance with rule 44.2; or
  - (b) take a Scoring Penalty in accordance with rule 44.3.

# 13 SCORING

- 13.1 The **Around-the-Island Race** on Friday, June 14, shall be scored separately and will not count in the Two-Day Series score.
- 13.2 Multiple races are planned in the **Two-Day Series**. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series. A yacht's series score will be the total of all of her race scores. There is no discard race.

- 13.3 Separate "Navigator" races will be held on Saturday, June 15, and Sunday, June 16. There will be one race each day. Each race will be scored separately.
- 13.4 IRC classes will be scored using the IRC Time Corrector (TCC) using time on time scoring.
- 13.5 PHRF classes will be scored using time on distance.
- 13.6 Classic Yachts will be scored using CRF.
- 13.7 The Around-the-Island Race Team Trophy for the Rolex Cup will be scored by using each team member yacht's percentage points (finish points divided by the number of starters) within its respective class. The trophy will be awarded to the team with the lowest average score.
- 13.8 The Great Corinthian Trophy will be scored by using each team member yacht's percentage points (finish points divided by the number of starters) within its respective class. The trophy will be awarded to the team with the lowest average score.

# 14 PRIZES

- 14.1 Around-the-Island Race prizes will be presented at the Awards Party after the race on Friday, June 14, at Harbour Court. Prizes for the Around-the-Island Race will be awarded to the top three yachts in each class.
- 14.2 A Rolex timepiece will be awarded to the overall winning yacht in the IRC division in the Around-the-Island Race.
- 14.3 The Rolex Cup will be presented to the best two-yacht team in the Around-the-Island Race at the Awards Party after the race on Friday, June 14, at Harbour Court.
- 14.4 Overall prizes will be presented at the Awards Party after racing on Sunday, June 16, at Harbour Court.
- 14.5 A Rolex timepiece will be awarded at the NYYC Annual Awards Dinner on Thursday, November 14, to the yacht which in the opinion of the OA makes the best overall performance in the Annual Regatta Two-Day Series.
- 14.6 The Great Corinthian Trophy will be presented at the NYYC Annual Awards Dinner on Thursday, November 14, to the yacht club team with the best score in the Annual Regatta.
- 14.7 The Solution Trophy may be awarded at the NYYC Annual Awards Dinner on November 14, to the enrolled New York Yacht Club yacht entered in the Annual Regatta, which, in the opinion of the Race Committee, makes the best overall performance in the Two-Day Series.

# 15 LIABILITY & MEDIA WAIVER

- 15.1 As a condition of entry, each owner, skipper and individual participating crew member shall submit an online liability waiver/media release. The fully executed Liability & Media Waiver Form shall be submitted prior to racing. The waiver form link can be found on the Annual Regatta website.
- 15.2 Media Waiver Competitors and crew members on the competing yachts grant, at no cost, the New York Yacht Club Regatta Association, Inc., New York Yacht Club, Rolex S.A., Rolex Watch U.S.A and affiliated companies the absolute right and permission to use their name, voice, image, likeness, biographical material as well as representations of the boats in any media worldwide (being television, print and internet media), including video footage, for the sole purposes of advertising, promoting, reporting and disseminating information regarding the Annual Regatta and the participants in the Annual Regatta.
- 15.3 Yachts shall not be scored unless the skipper/person-in-charge has submitted a liability & media waiver form.
- 15.4 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority, New York Yacht Club, Rolex Watch U.S.A. and affiliated companies, and other sponsors will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. Attention is also drawn to ISAF Offshore Special Regulation 1.02, Responsibility of the Person in Charge.
